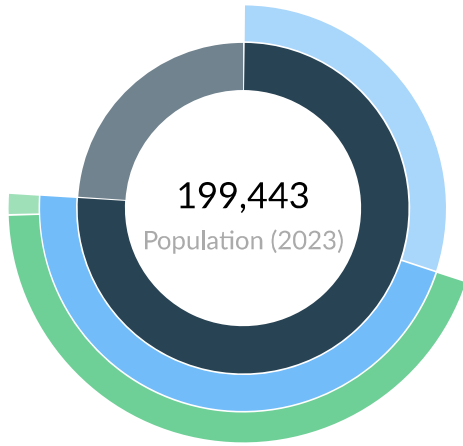

- The top three industries in 2022 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

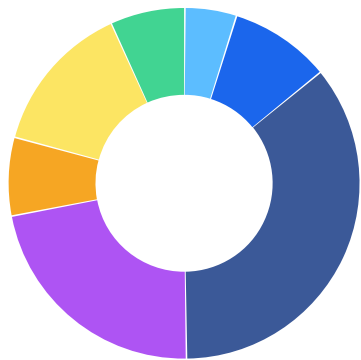

Educational Attainment

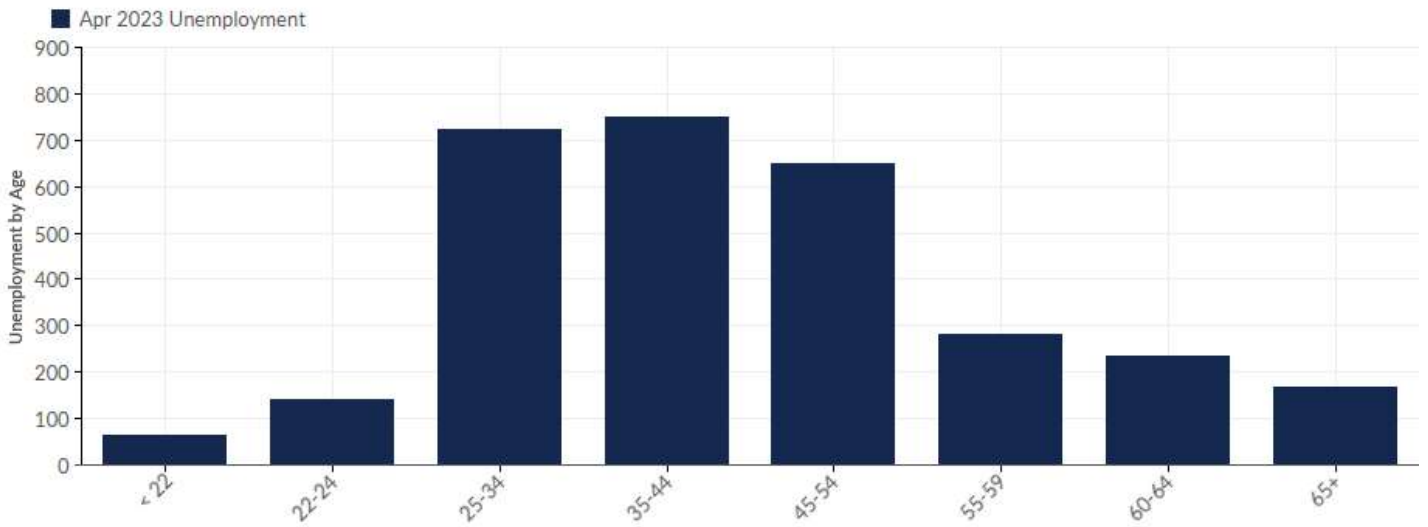

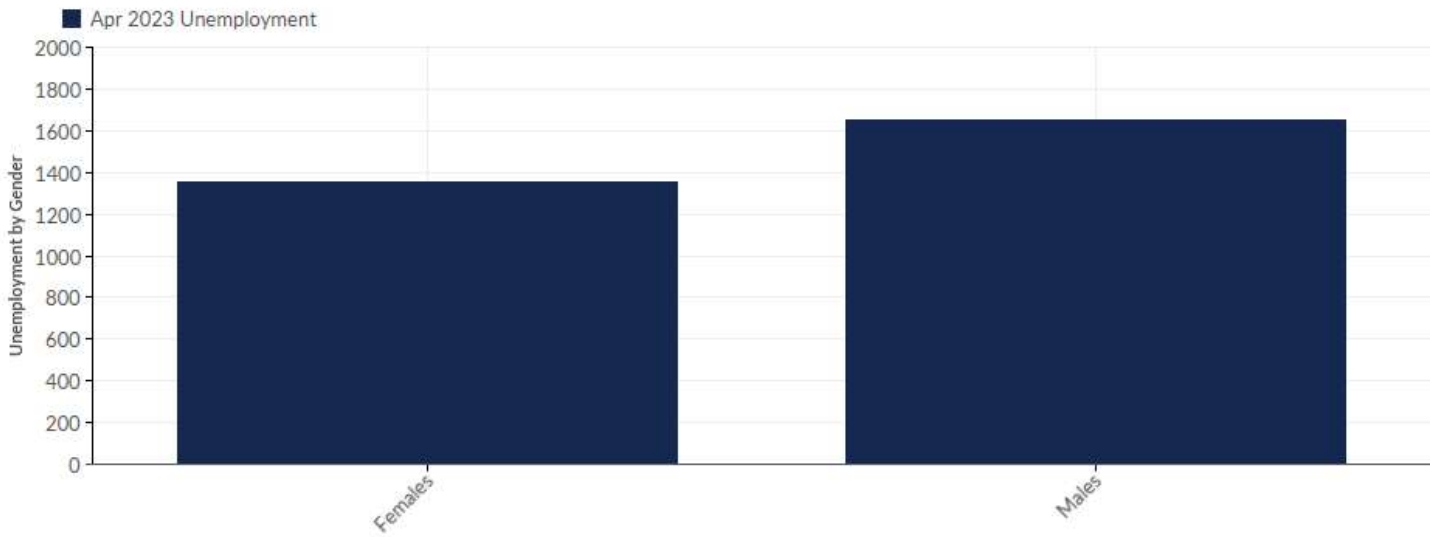

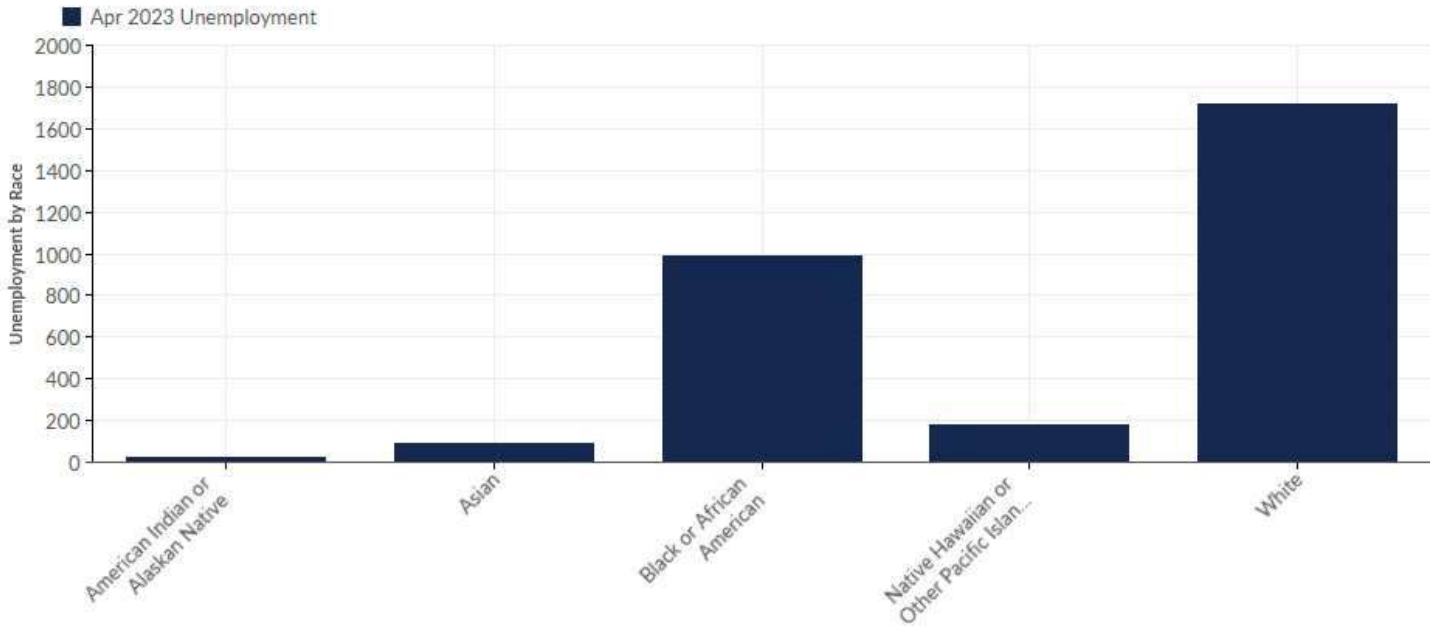

Unemployment by Gender



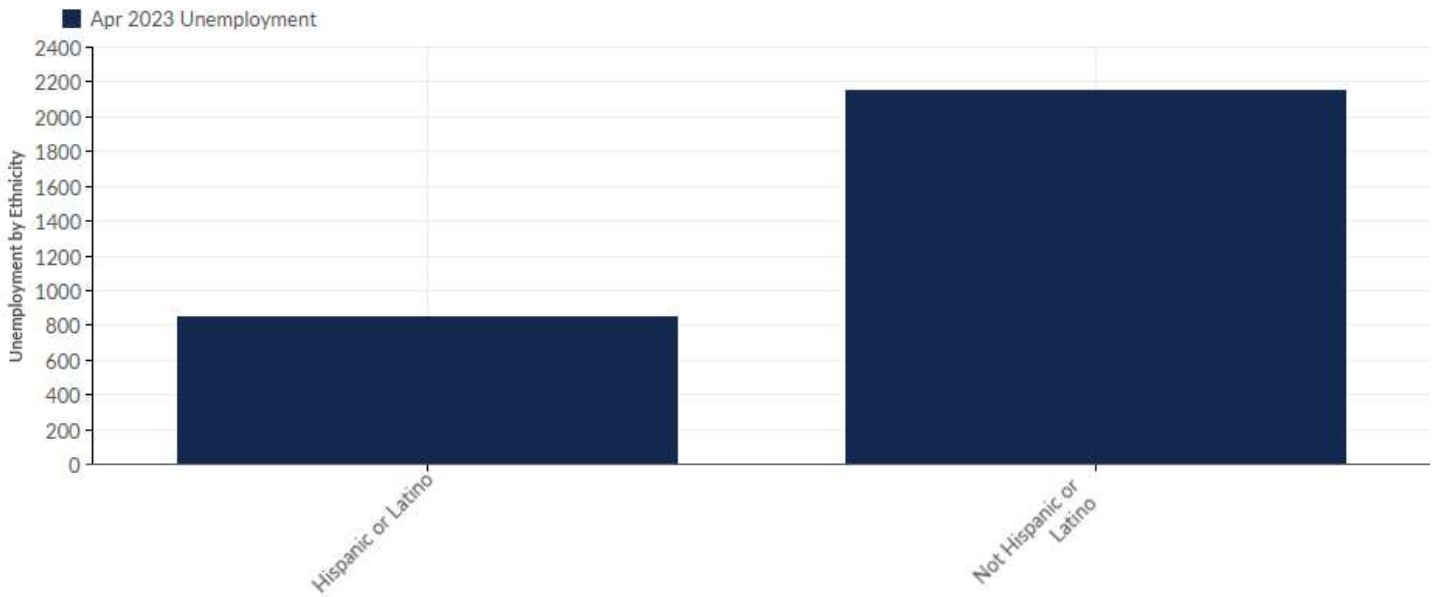

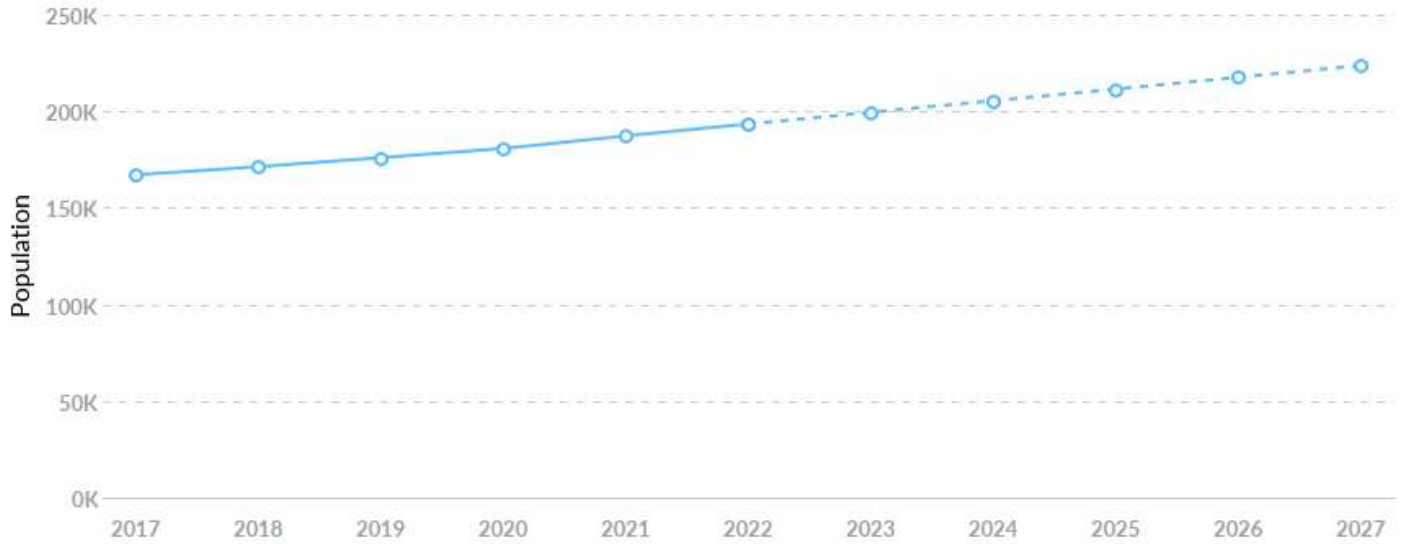

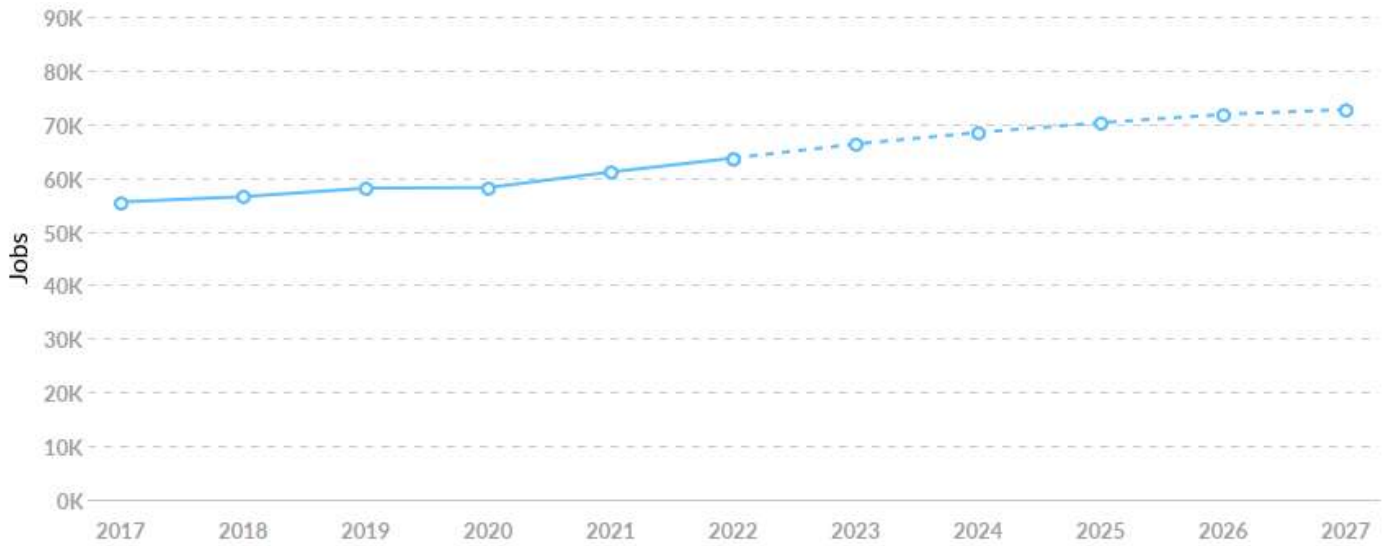

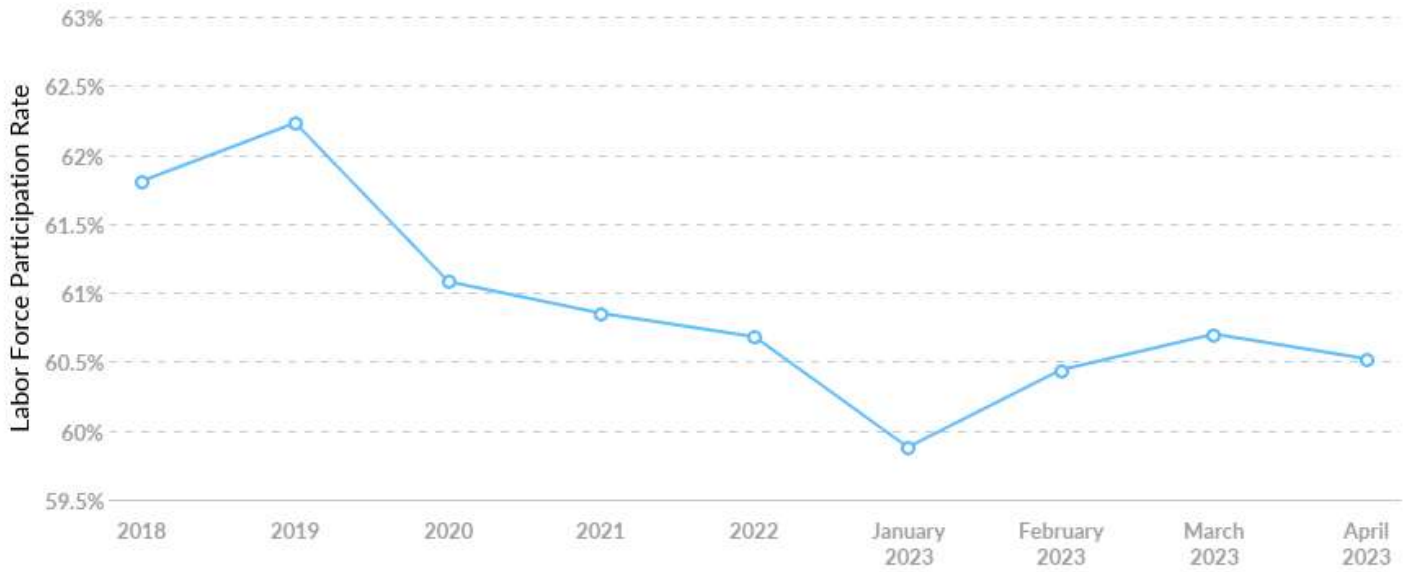
Job Trends

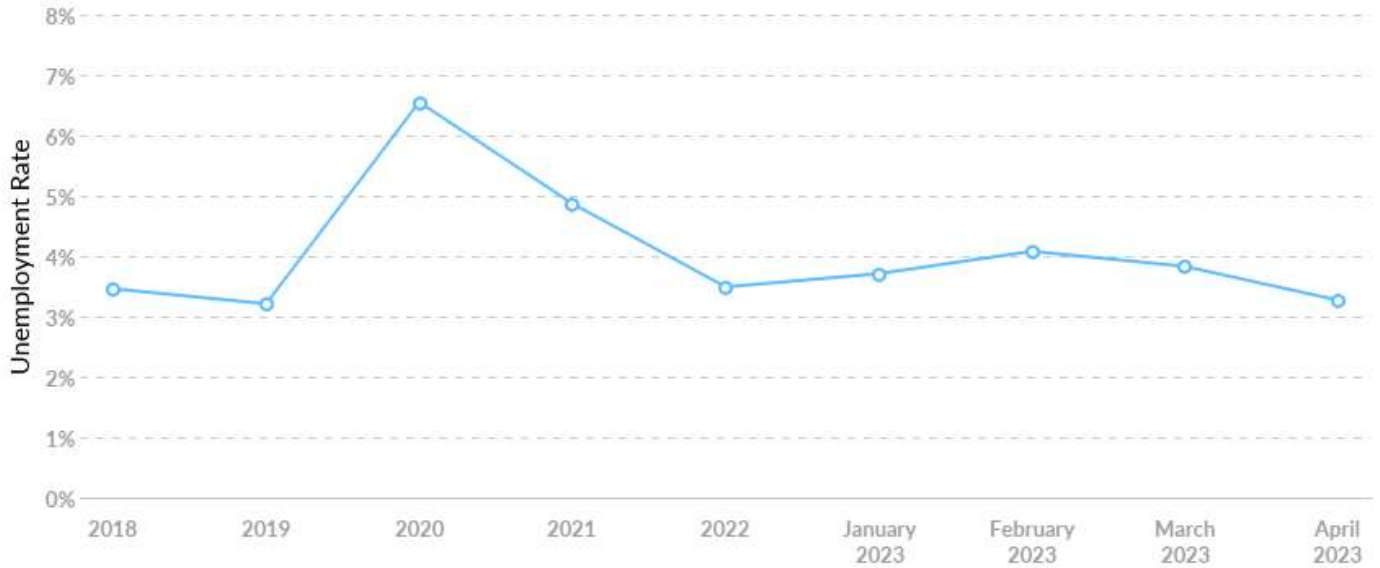

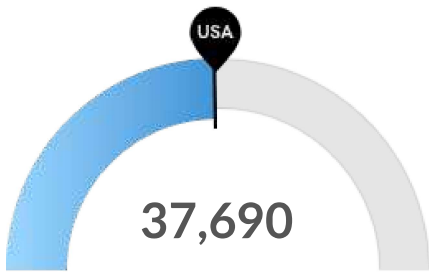
Unemployment Rate Trends

Johnson County, TX had an April 2023 unemployment rate of 3.27%, **decreasing from 3.46%** 5 years before.



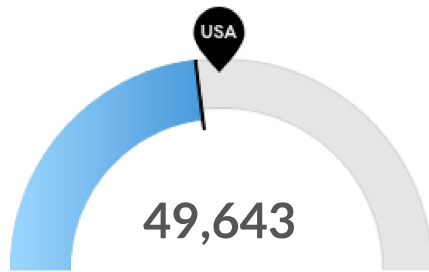

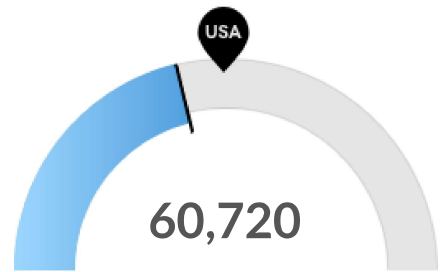
Millennials

Johnson County, TX has 37,690 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 38,255.



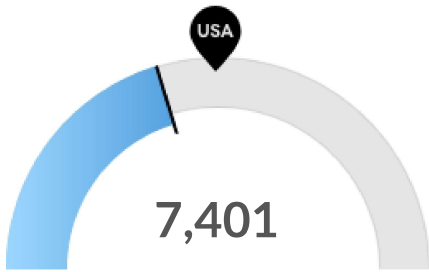
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is low in Johnson County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 55,666 people 55 or older, while there are 49,643 here.



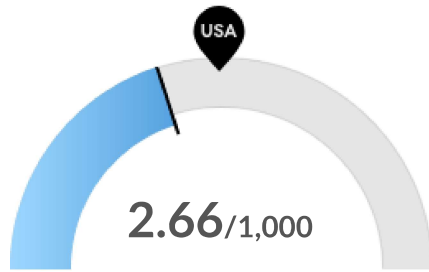
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Johnson County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 76,211 racially diverse people, while there are 60,720 here.



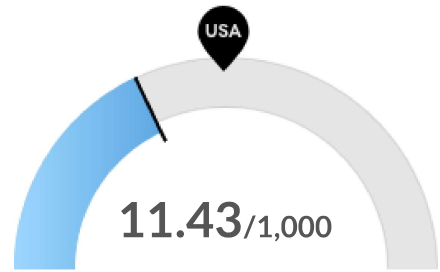
Veterans

Johnson County, TX has 2.66 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.59 per 1,000 people.

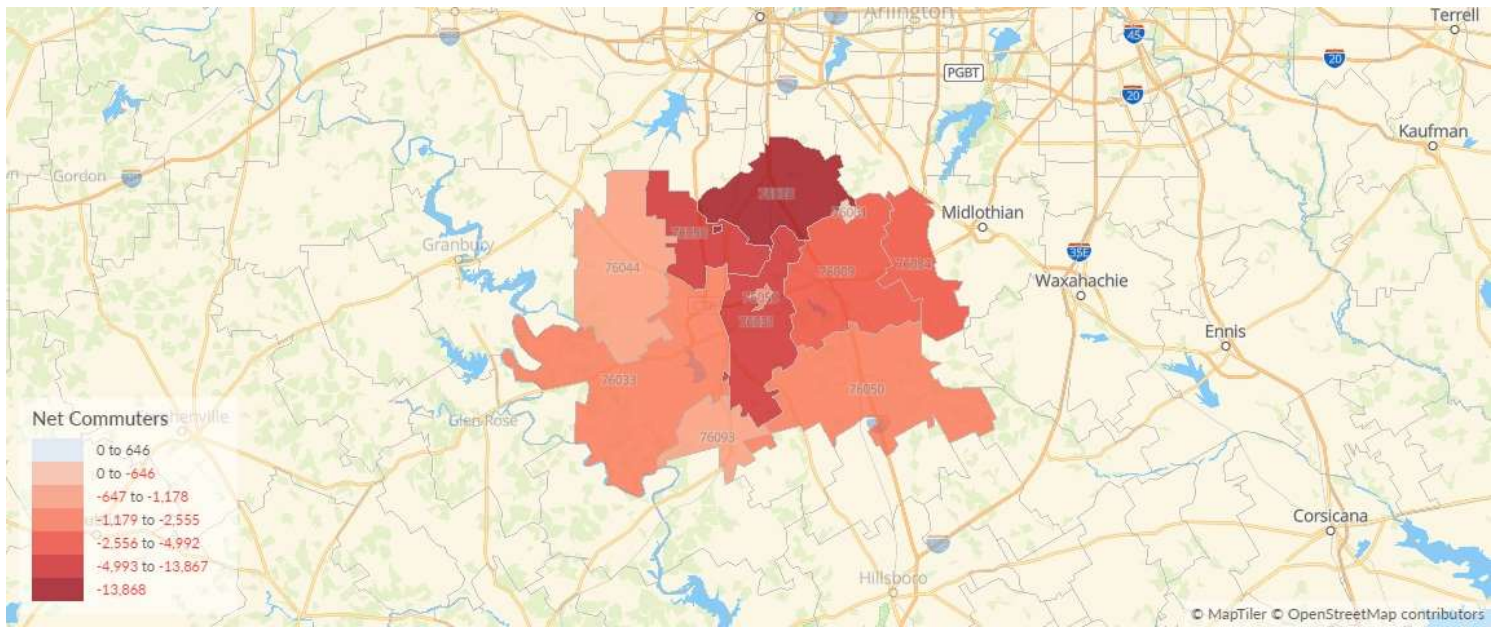


Property Crime

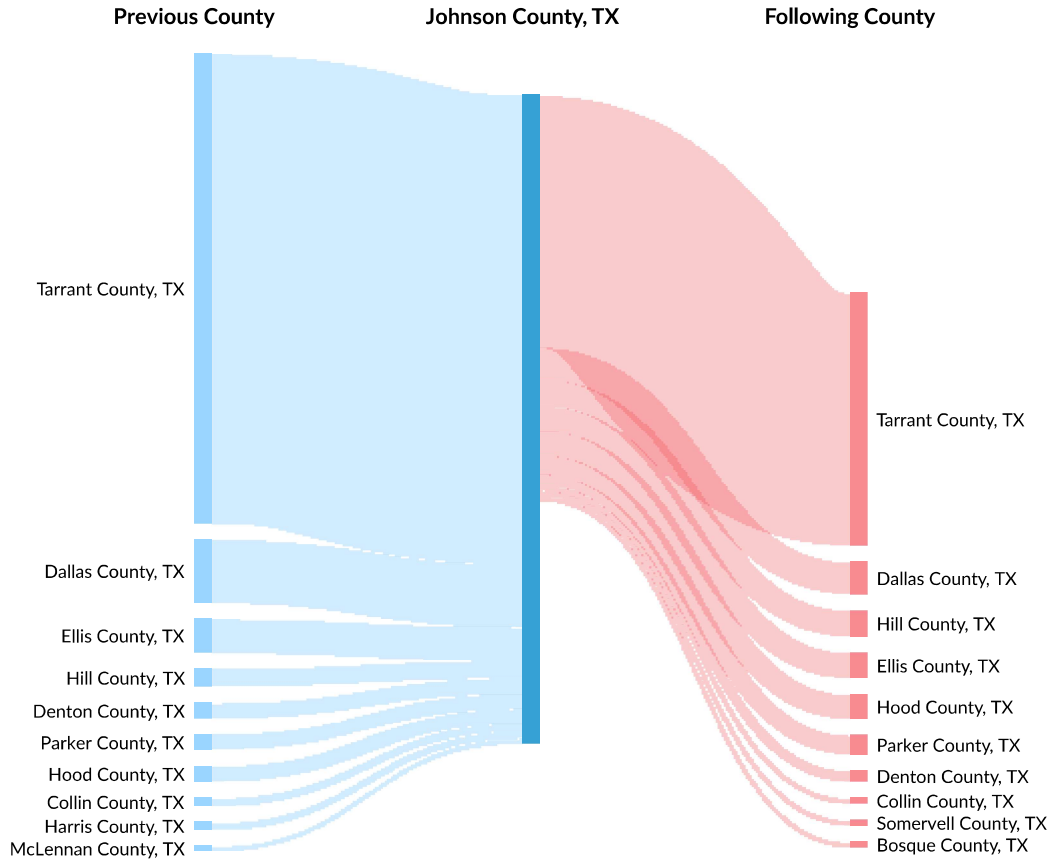

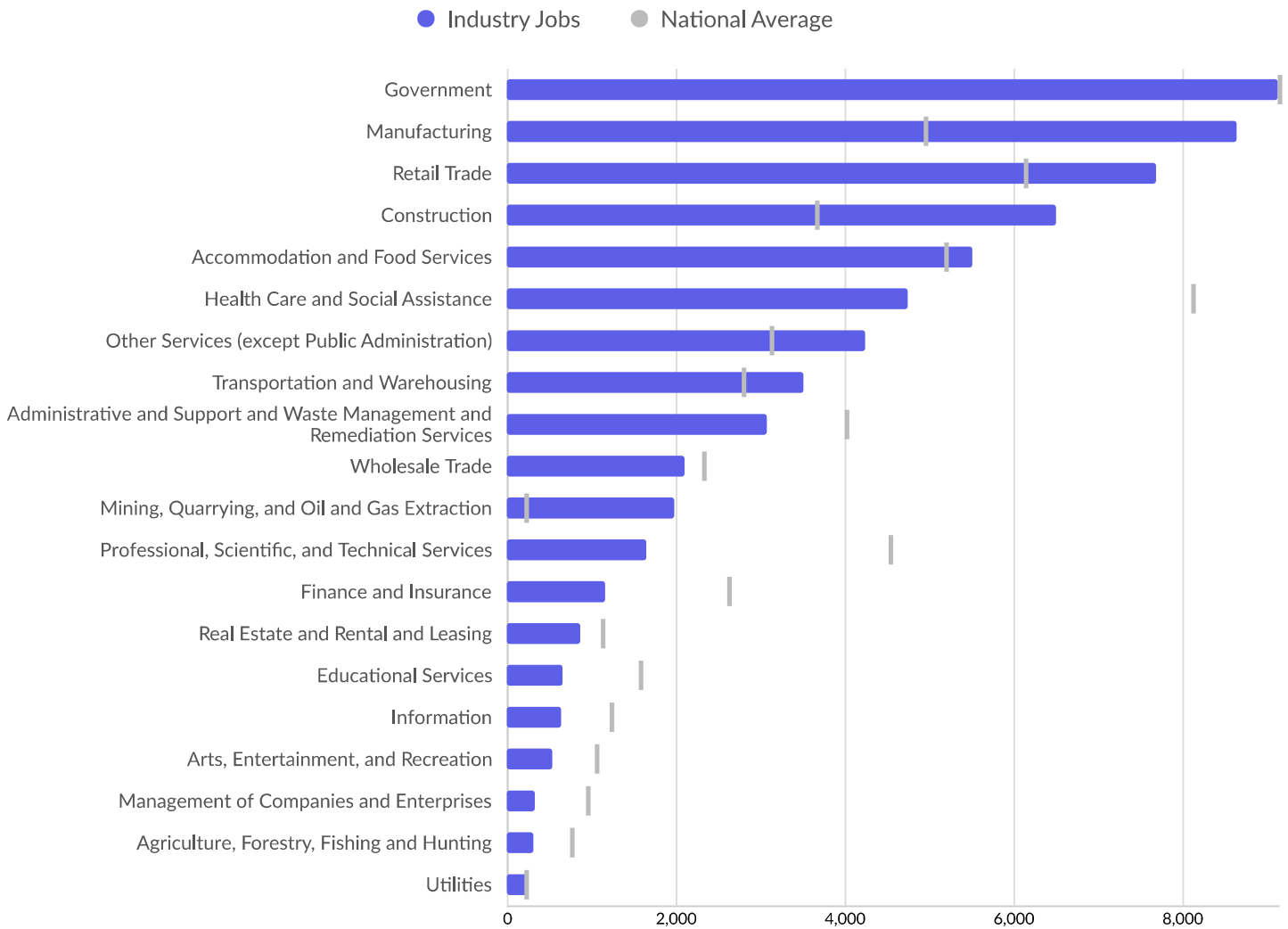

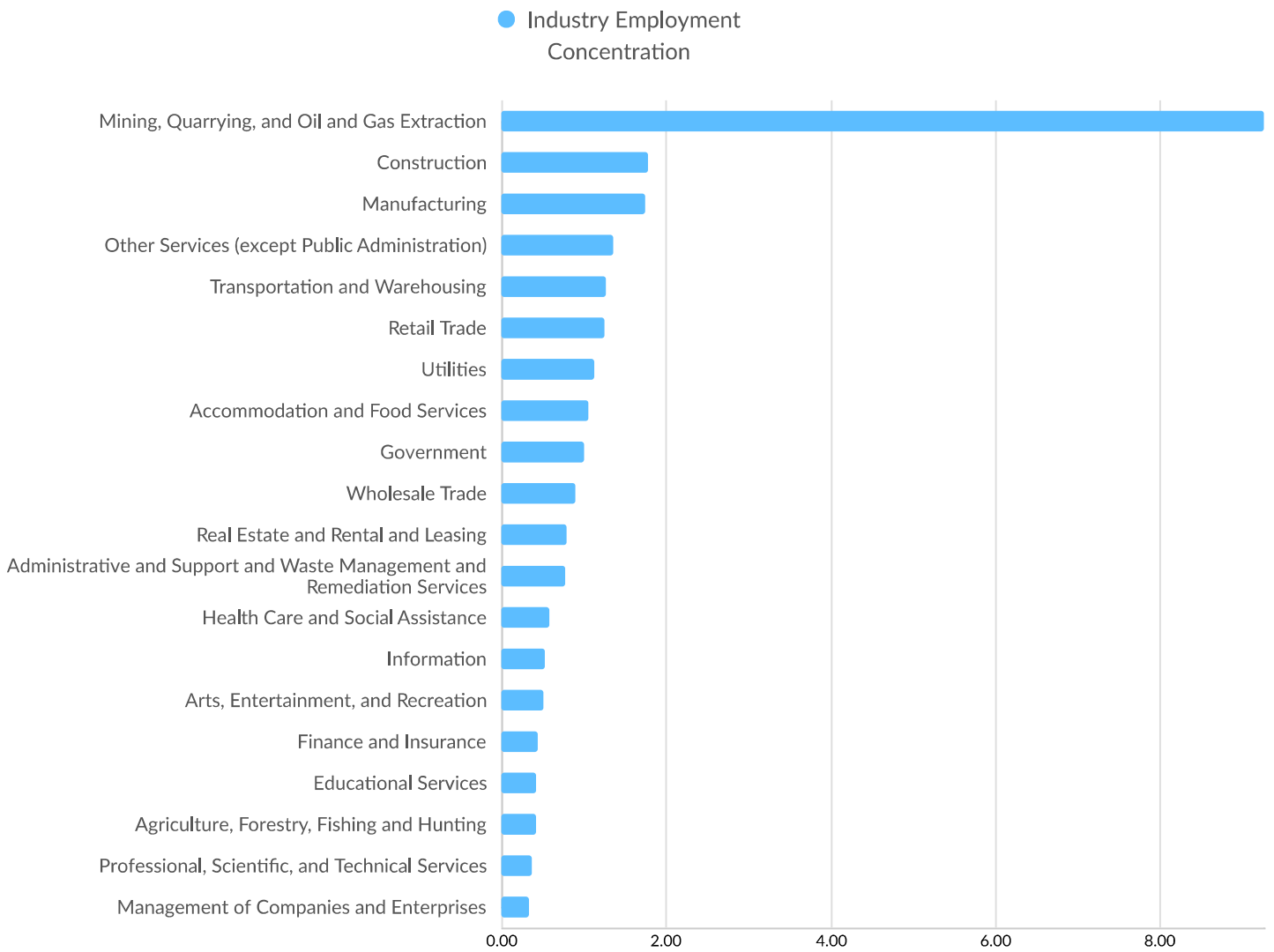

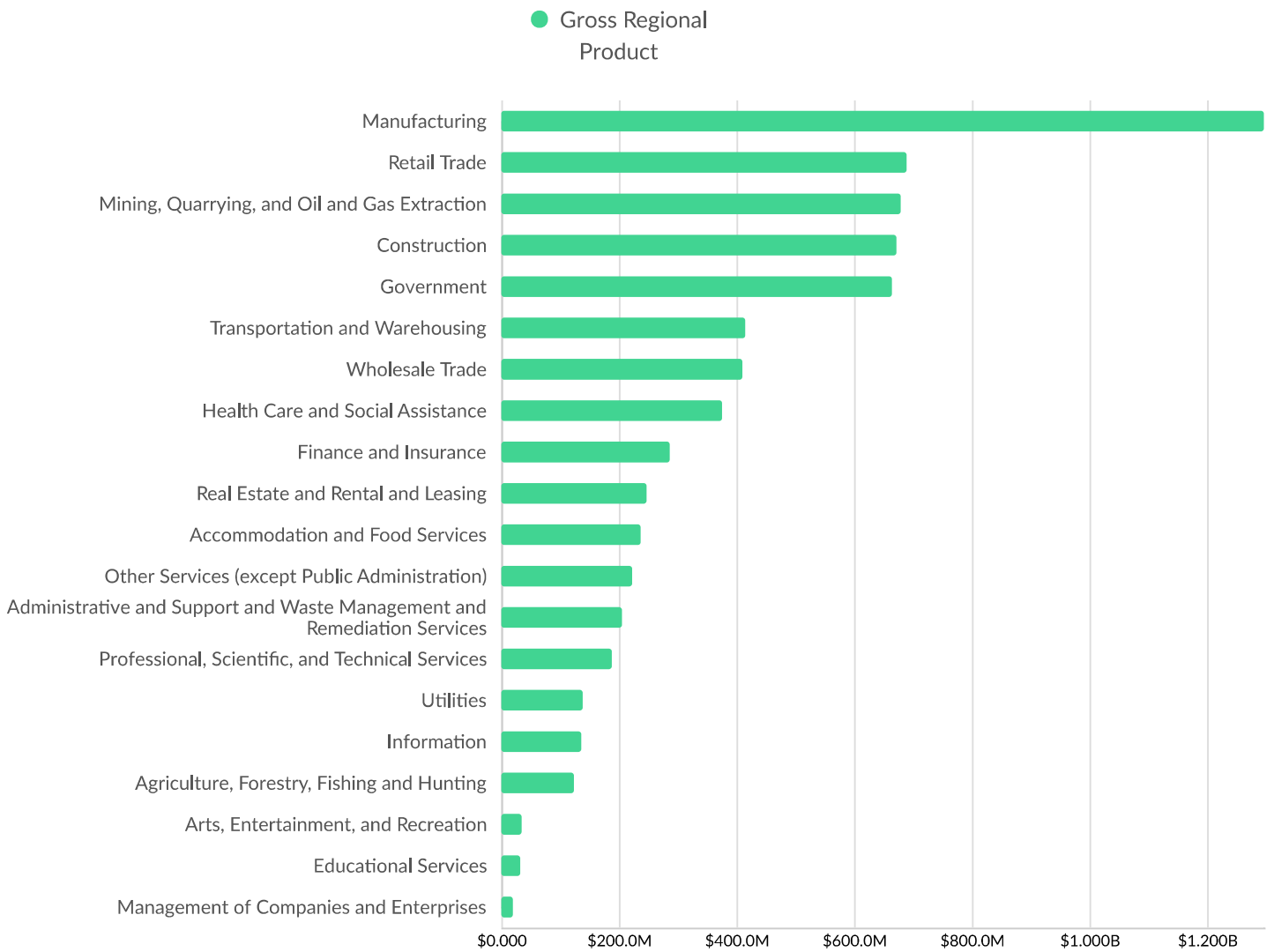
Top Growing Industries



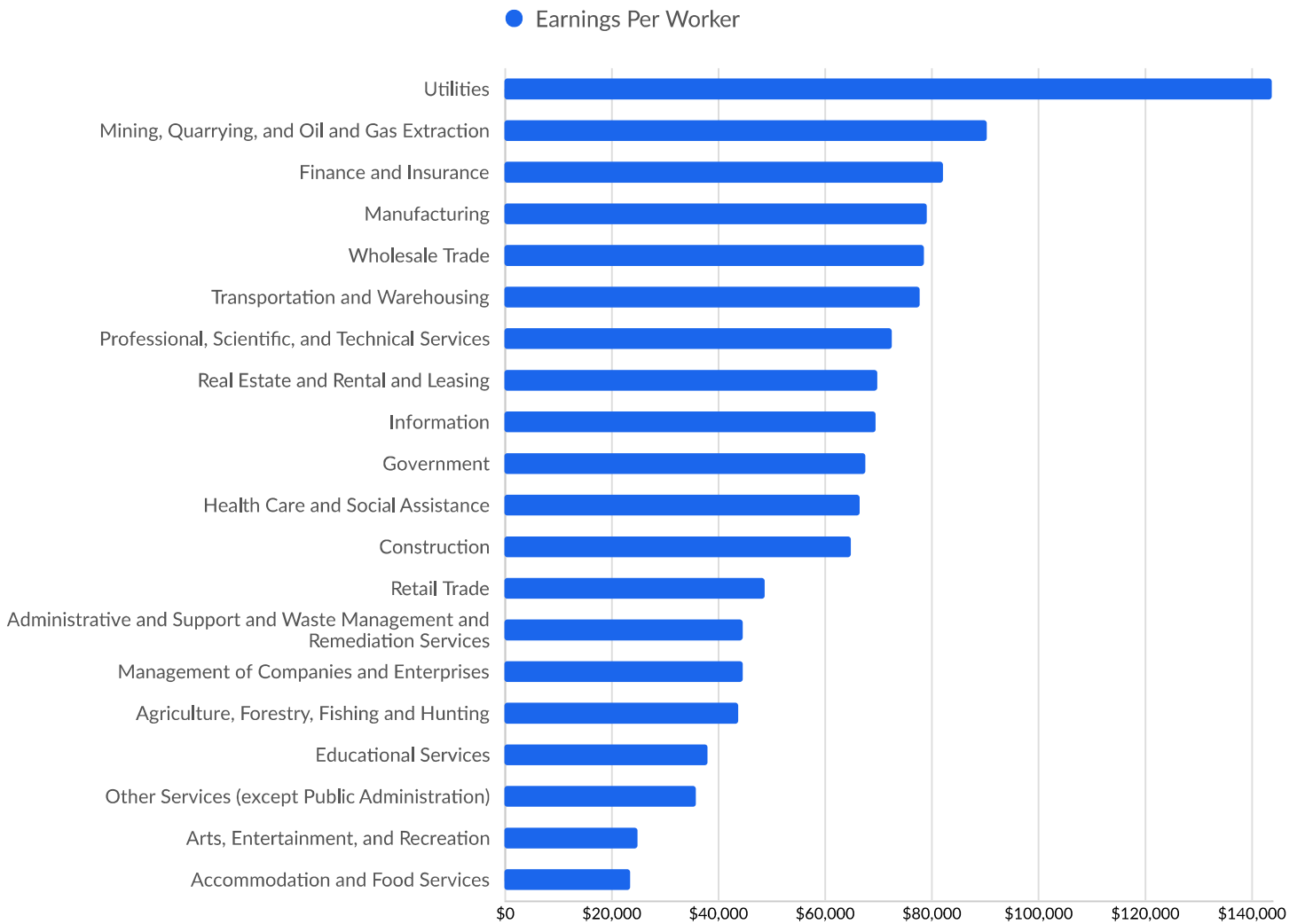
Top Industry Employment Concentration

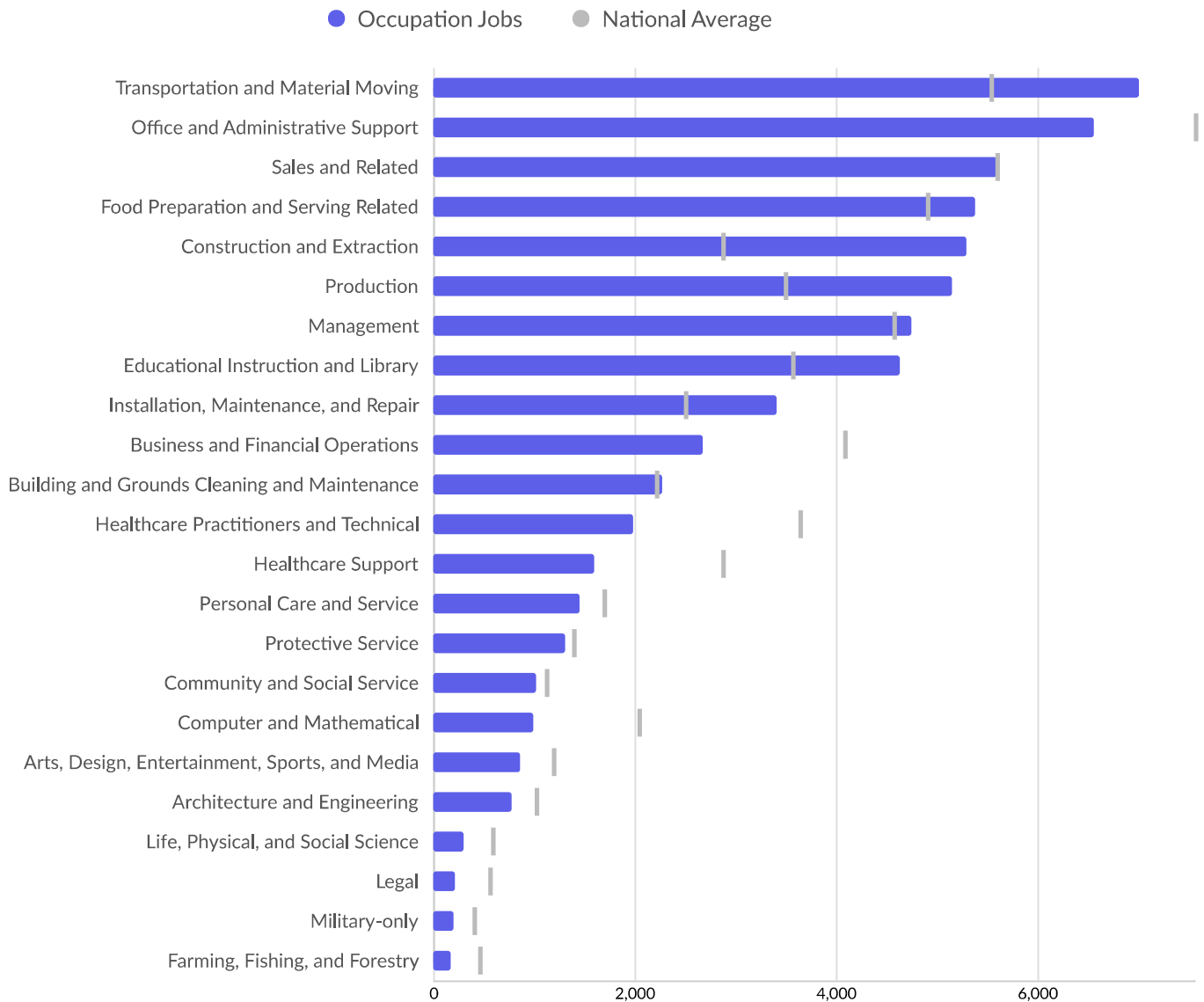

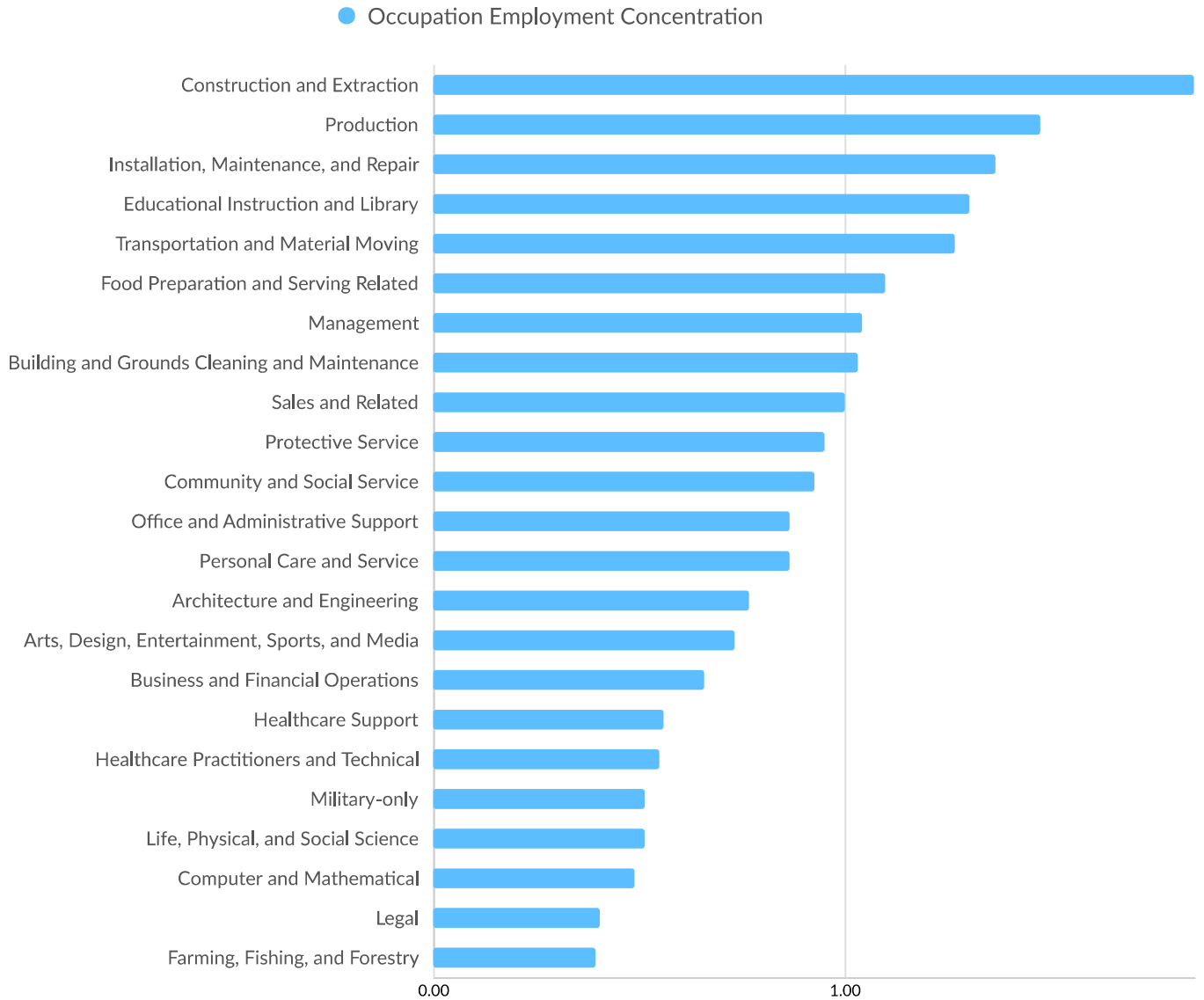

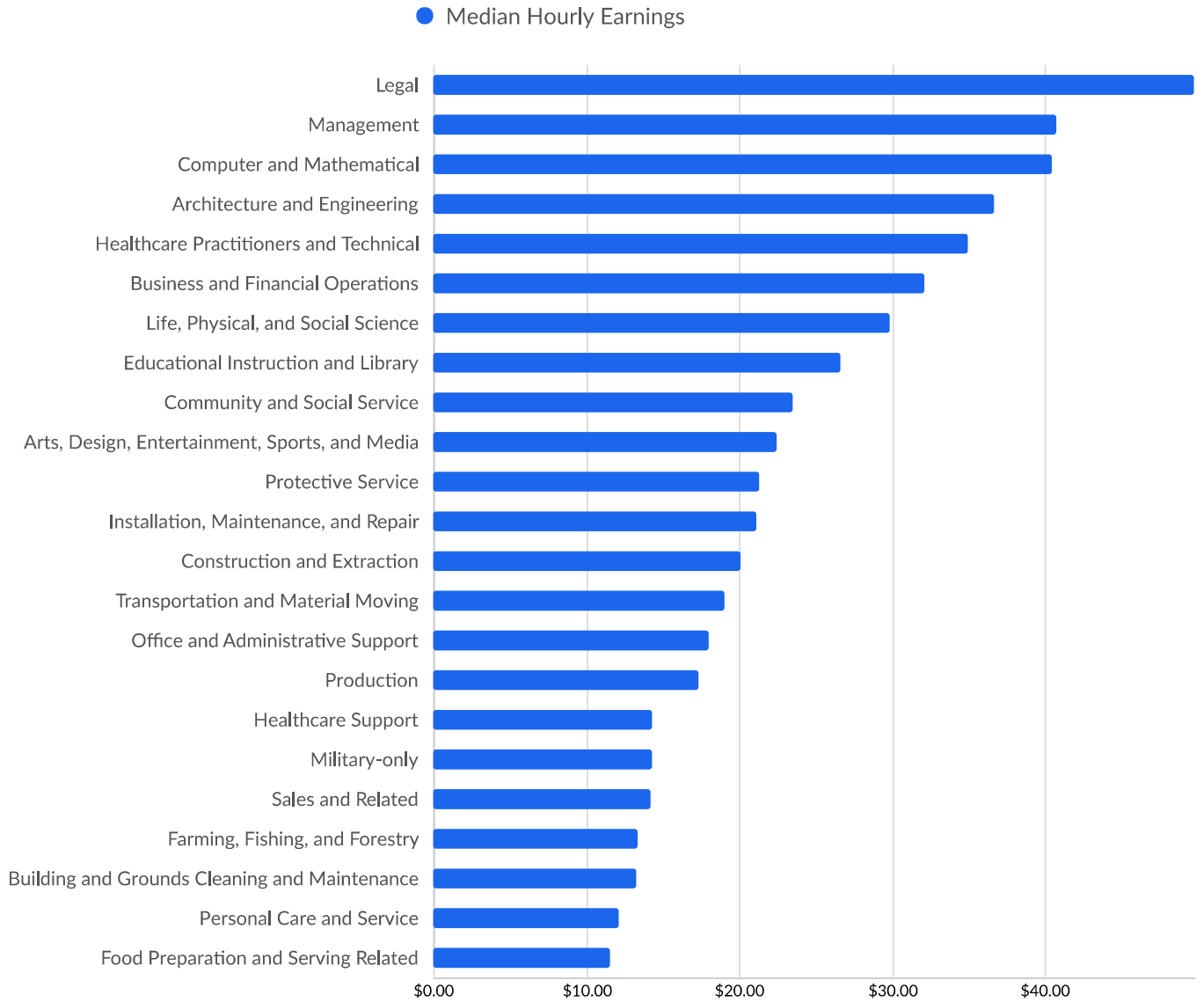
Top Growing Occupations



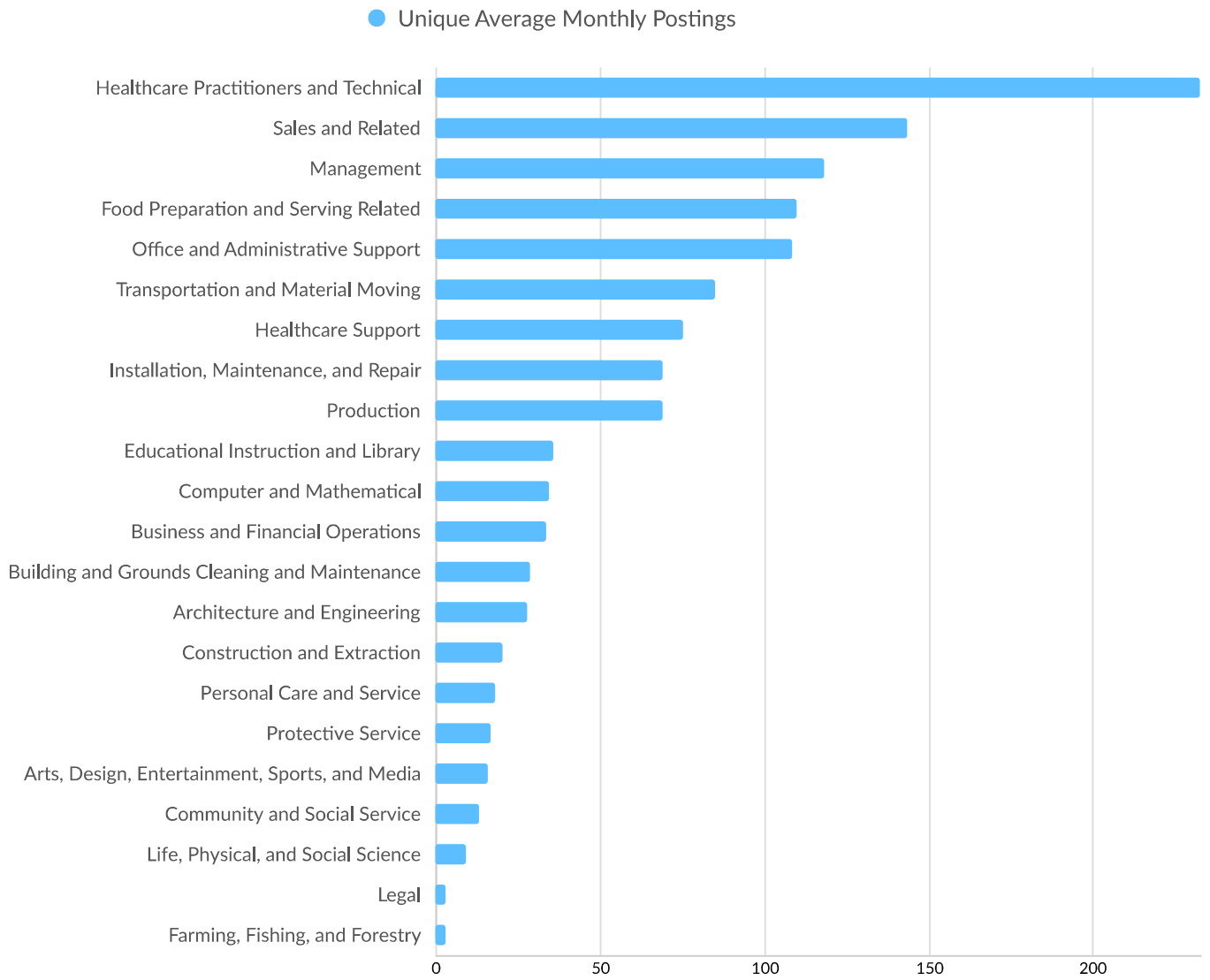
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



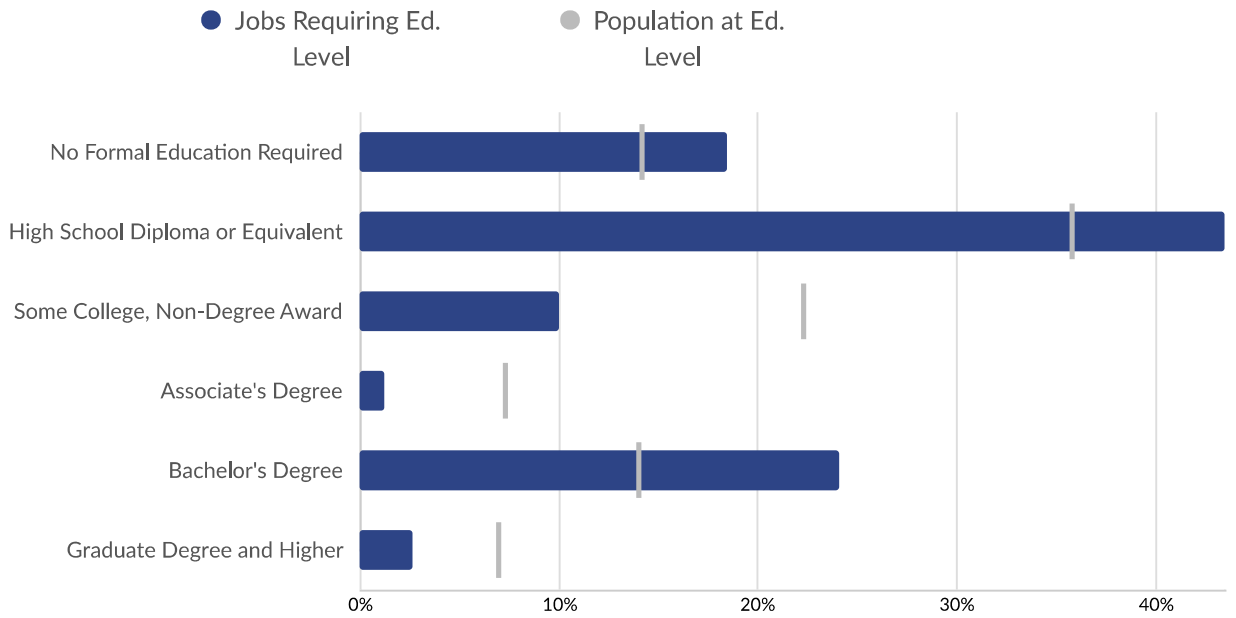
Top Occupation Earnings

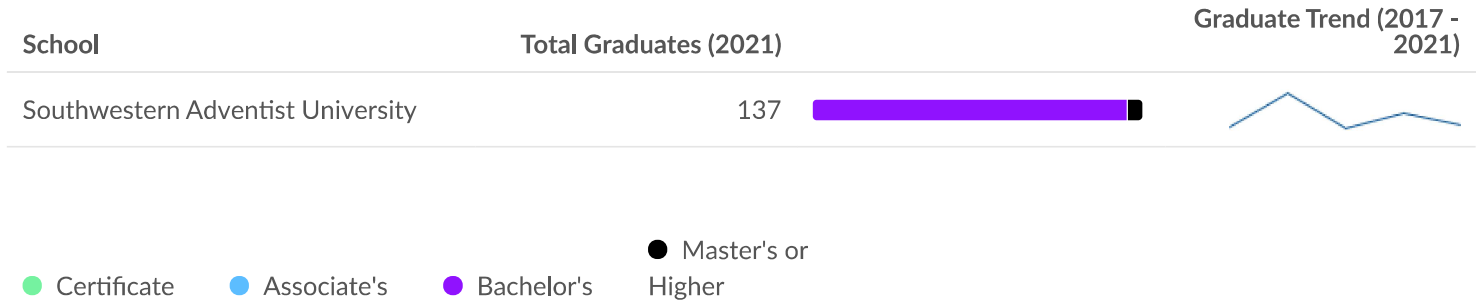
