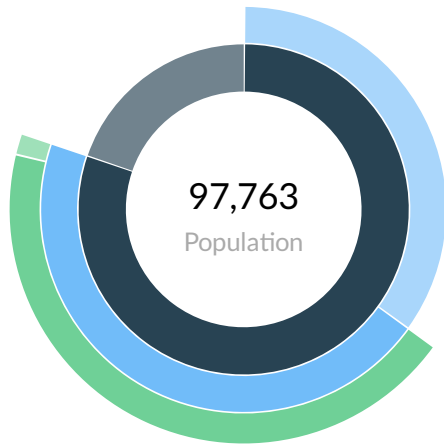
Median household income is **\$8.4K below** the national median household income of \$60.3K.

Takeaways

- As of 2019 the region's population **increased by 10.2%** since 2014, growing by 9,084. Population is expected to **increase by 6.5%** between 2019 and 2024, adding 6,345.
- From 2014 to 2019, jobs **increased by 4.1%** in Hunt County, TX from 31,988 to **33,306**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 7.6% by 3.5%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 53.6% to 56.5% between 2014 and 2019**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **12.8% of Hunt County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.0% below the national average), and **6.5% hold an Associate's Degree** (1.6% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2019 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Aerospace Product and Parts Manufacturing, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.

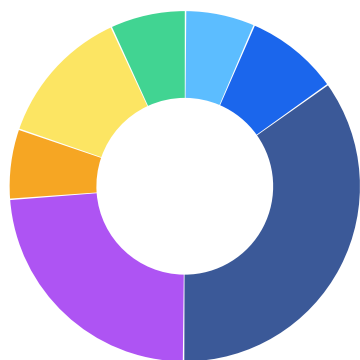

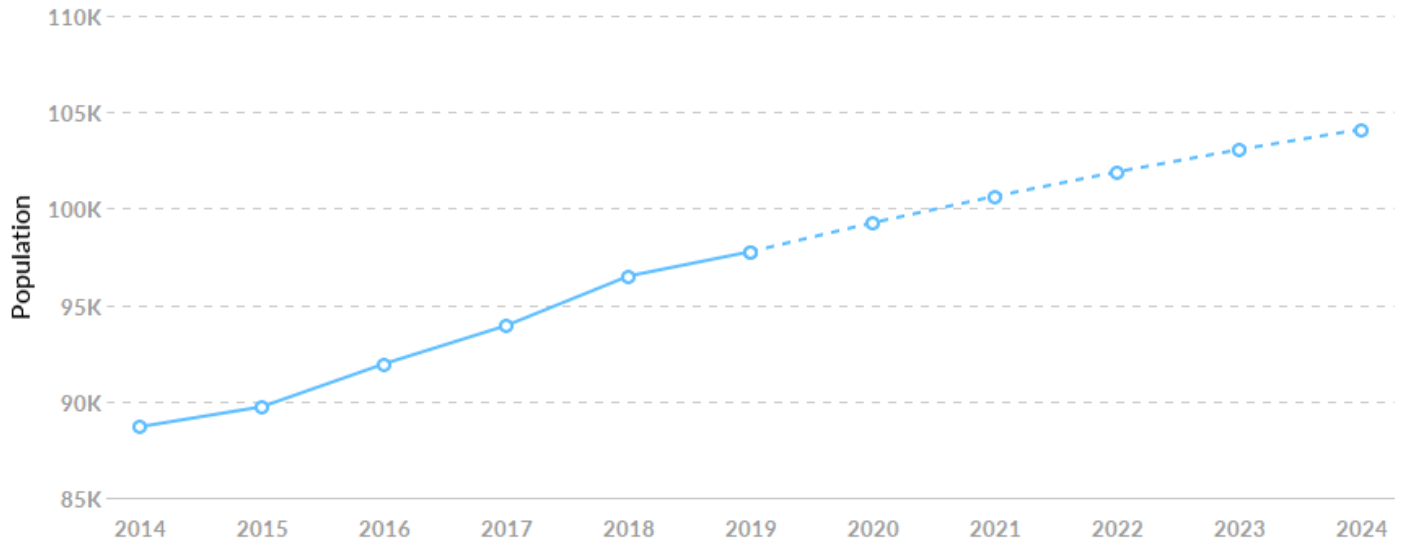

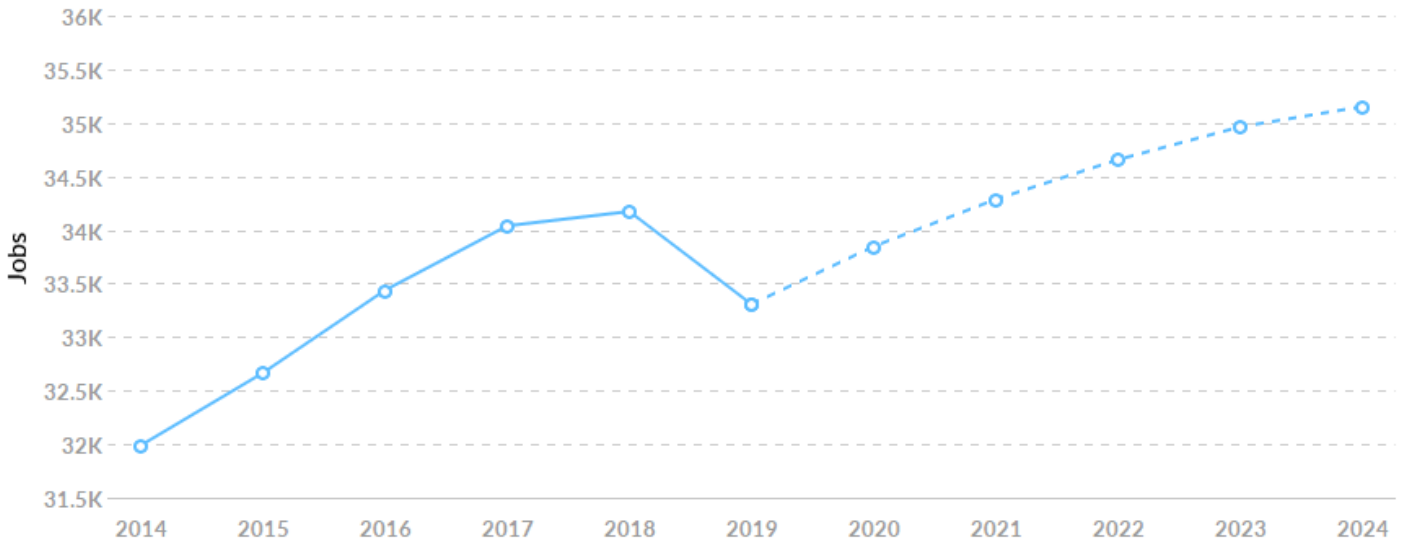

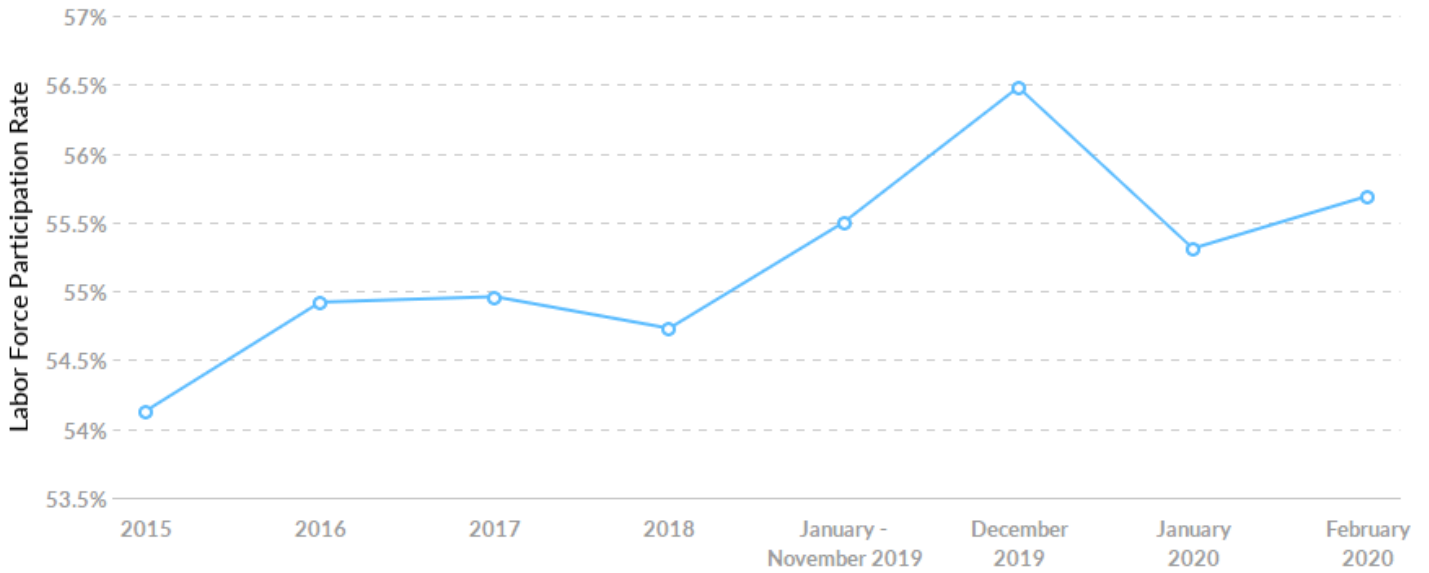
Job Trends

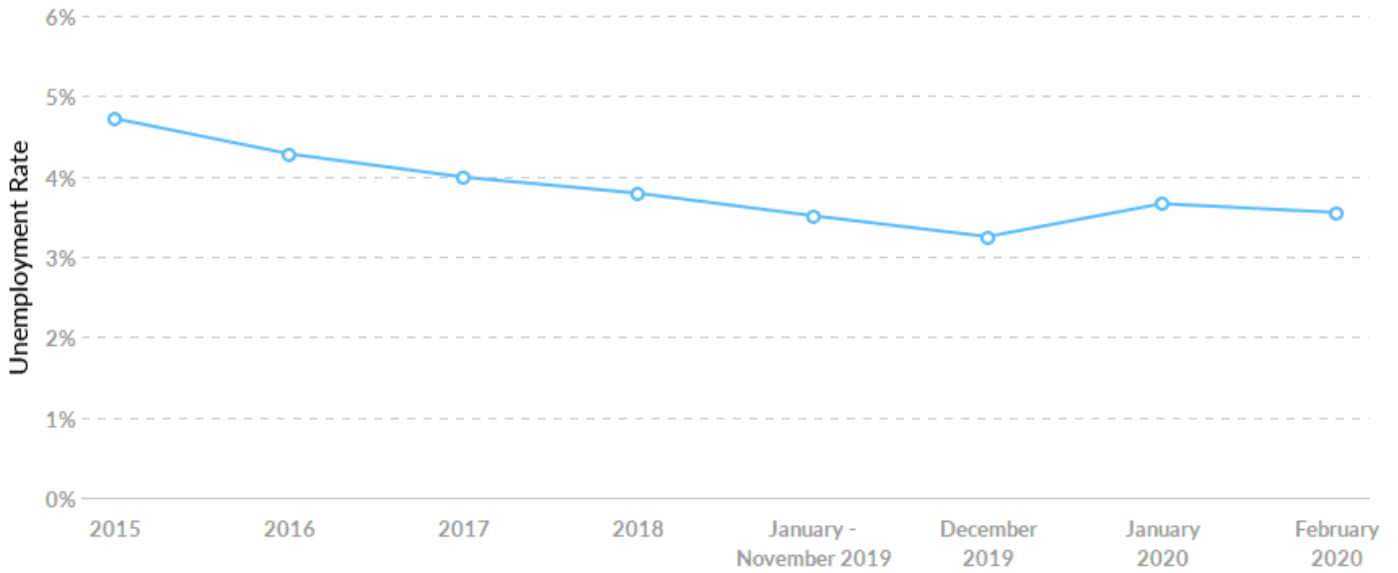

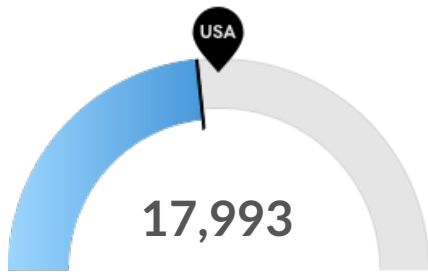
Unemployment Rate Trends

Hunt County, TX had a February 2020 unemployment rate of 3.55%, **decreasing from 4.72%** 5 years before.



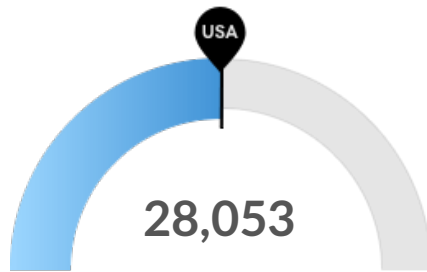

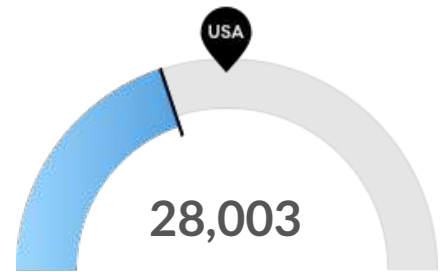
Millennials

Hunt County, TX has 17,993 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 19,838.



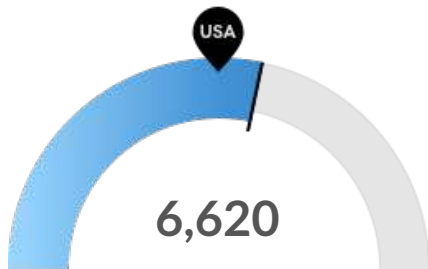
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is about average in Hunt County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 27,931 people 55 or older, while there are 28,053 here.



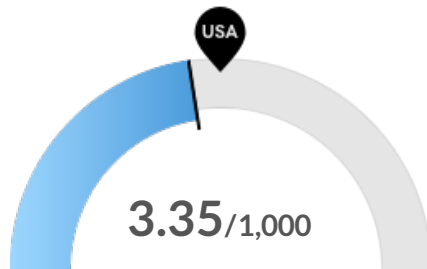
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Hunt County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 38,230 racially diverse people, while there are 28,003 here.



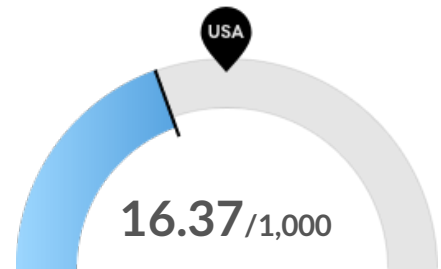
Veterans

Hunt County, TX has 3.35 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.87 per 1,000 people.

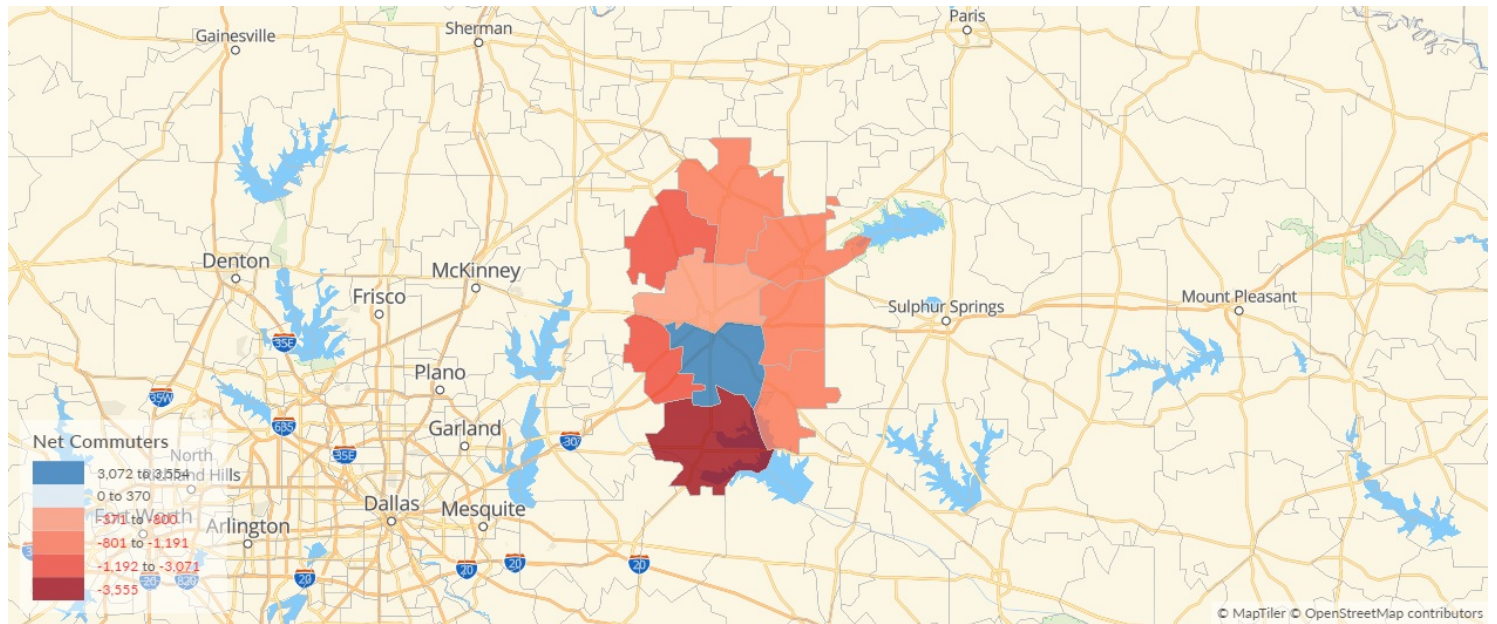


Property Crime

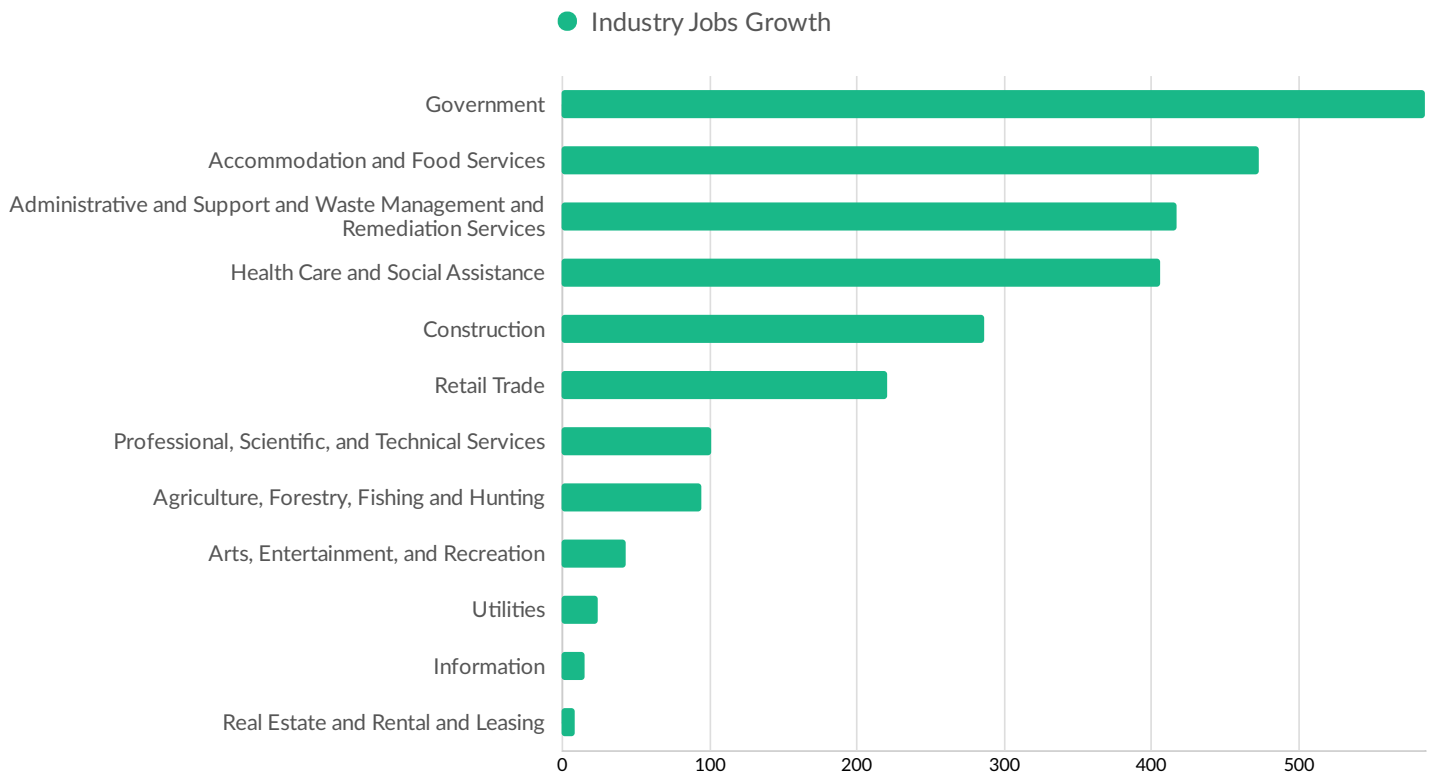

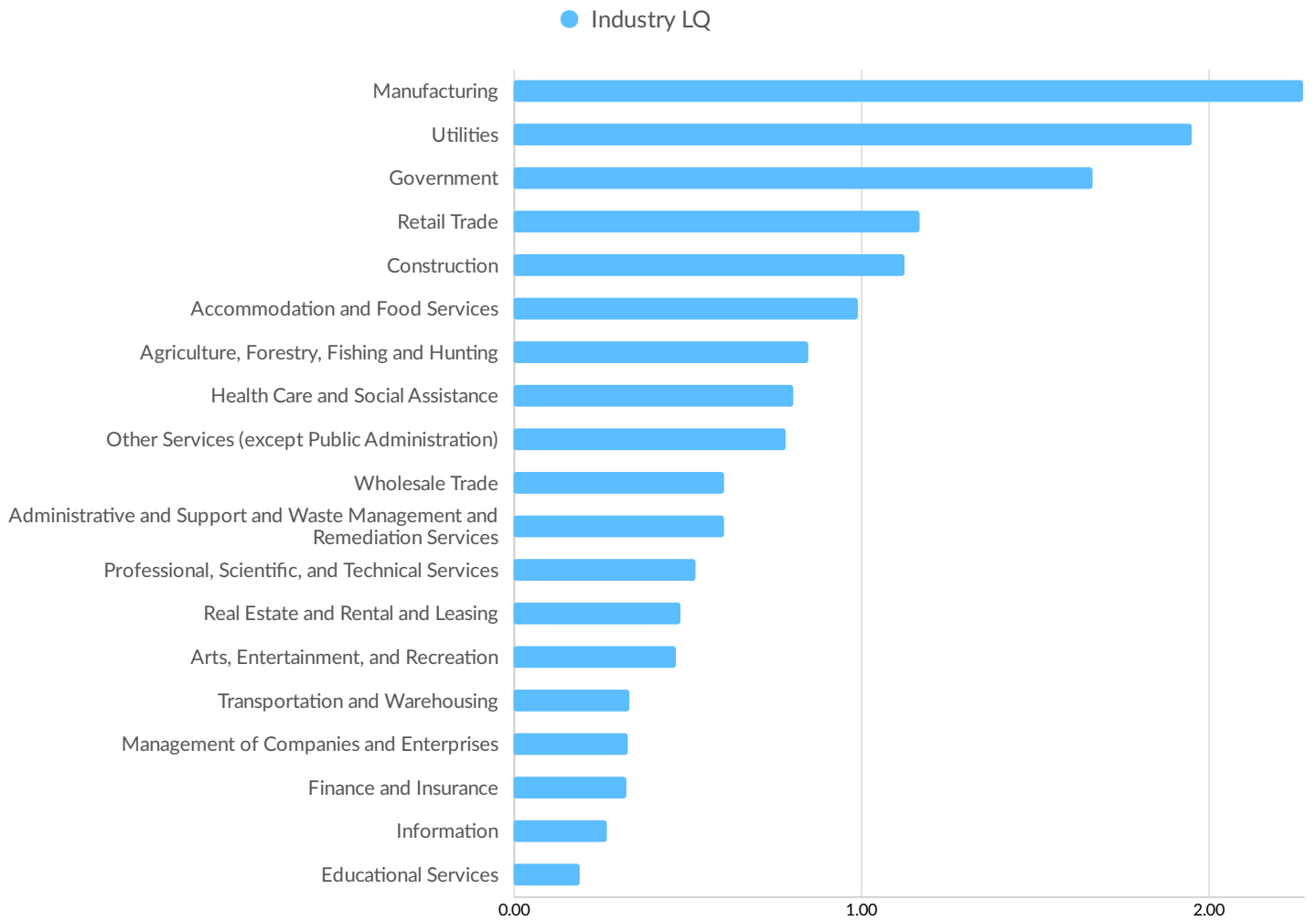

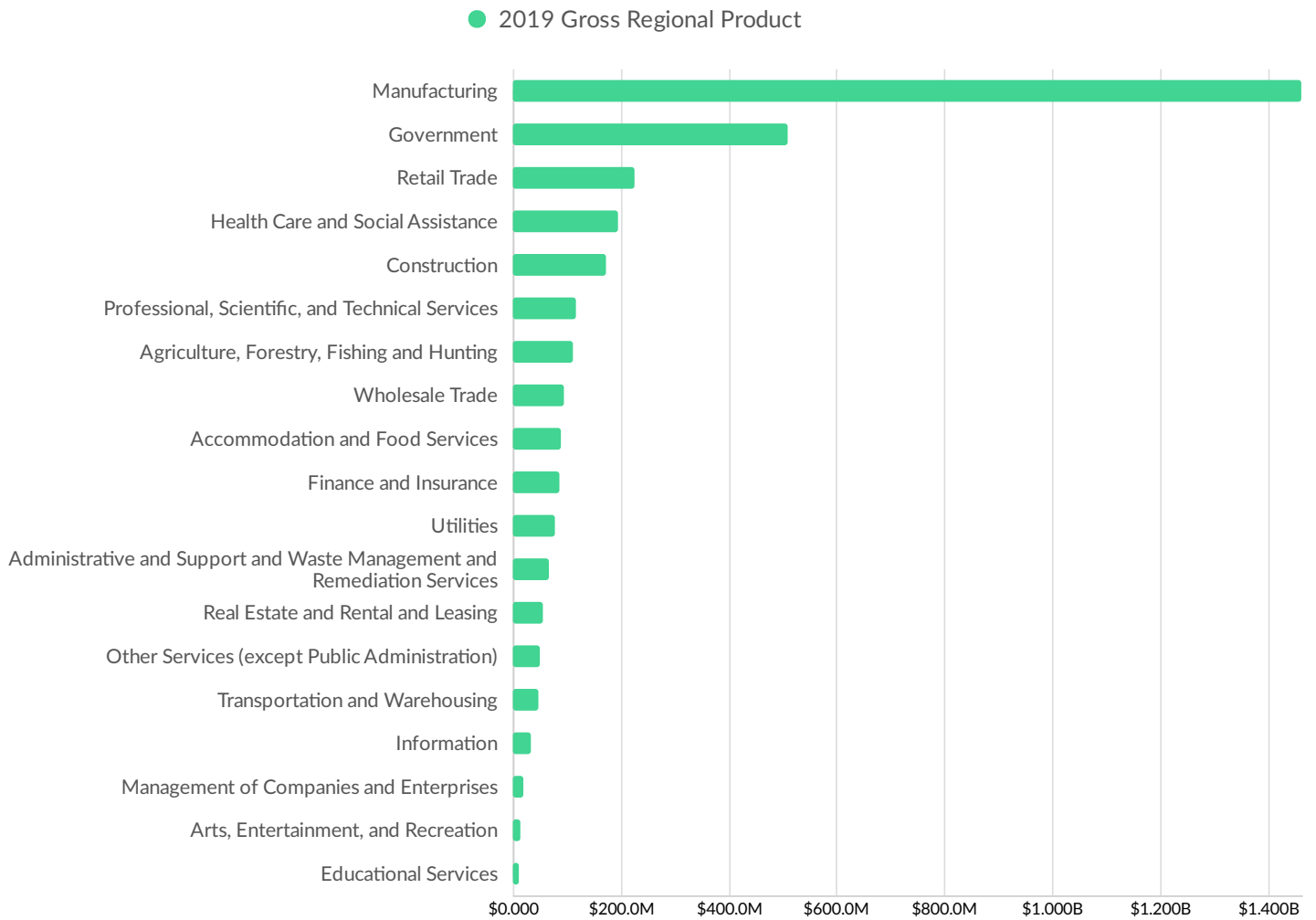

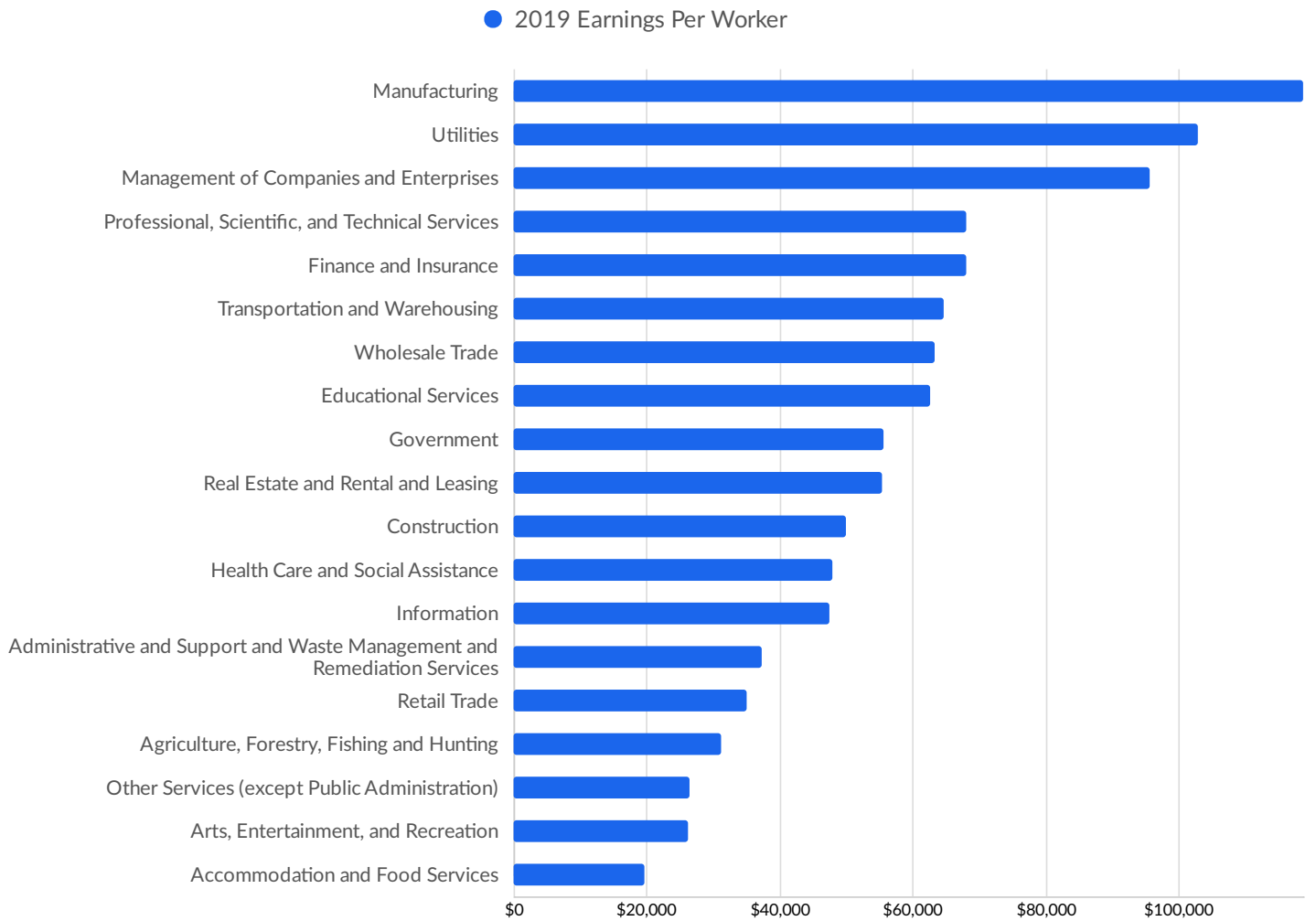

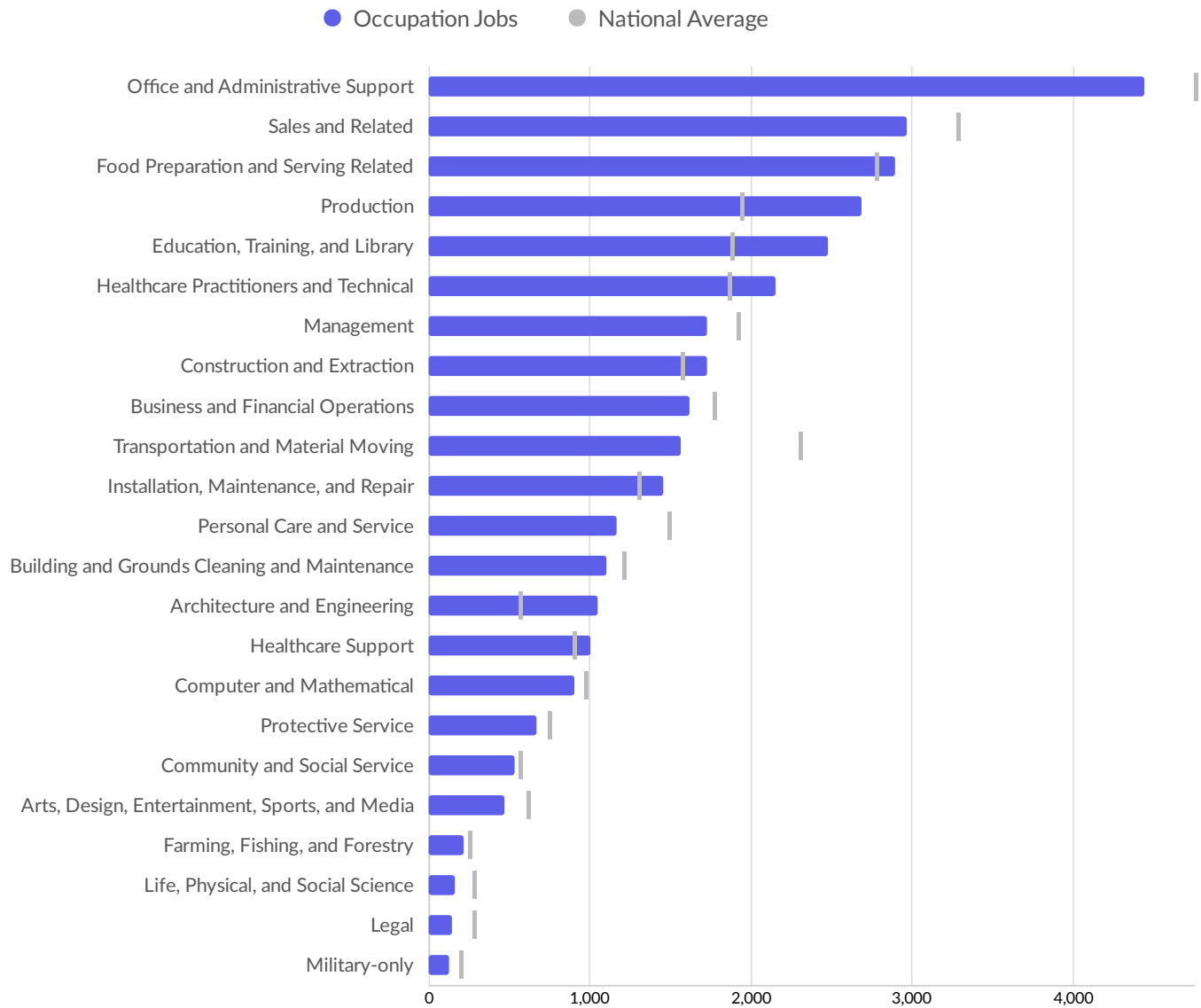

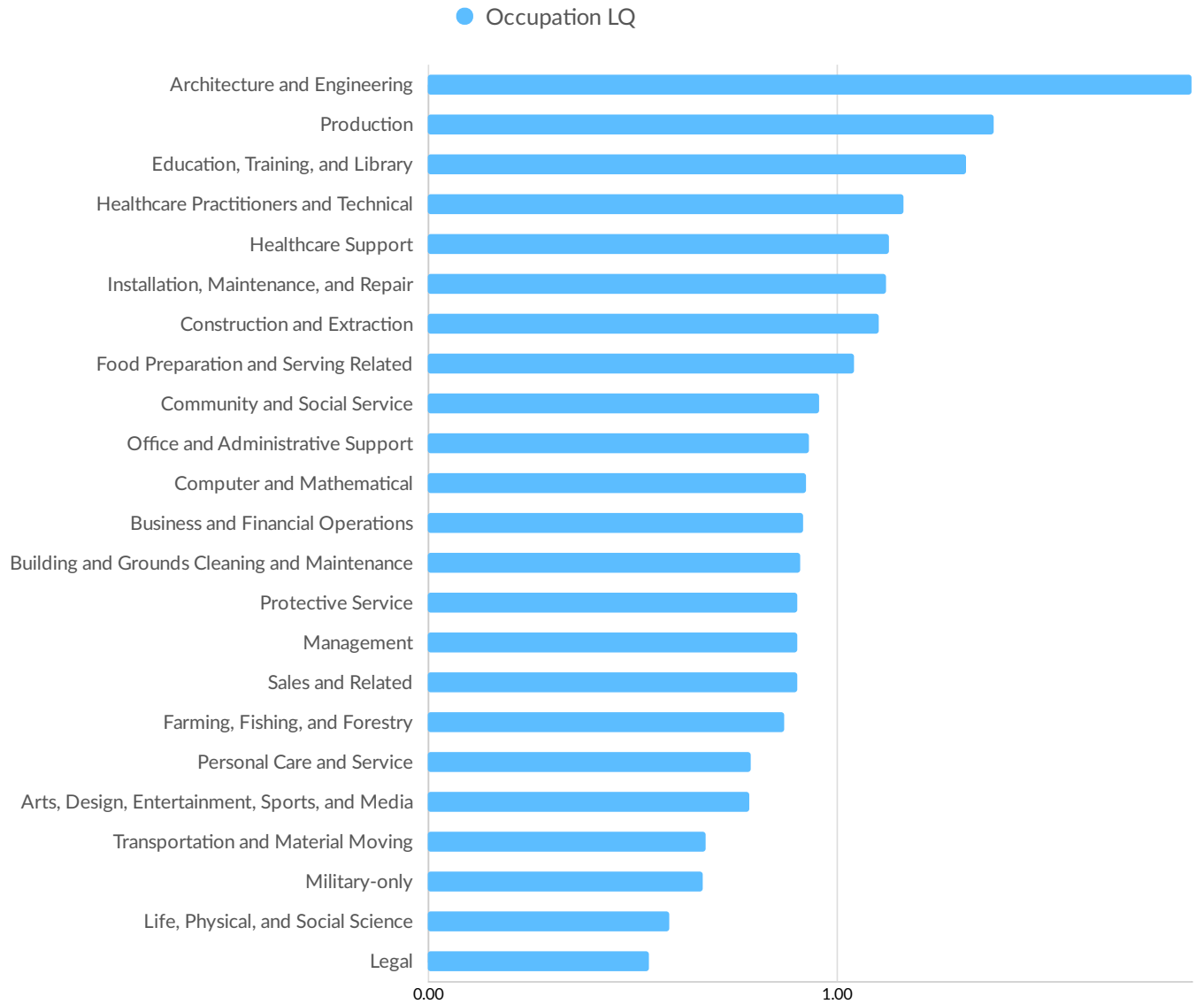

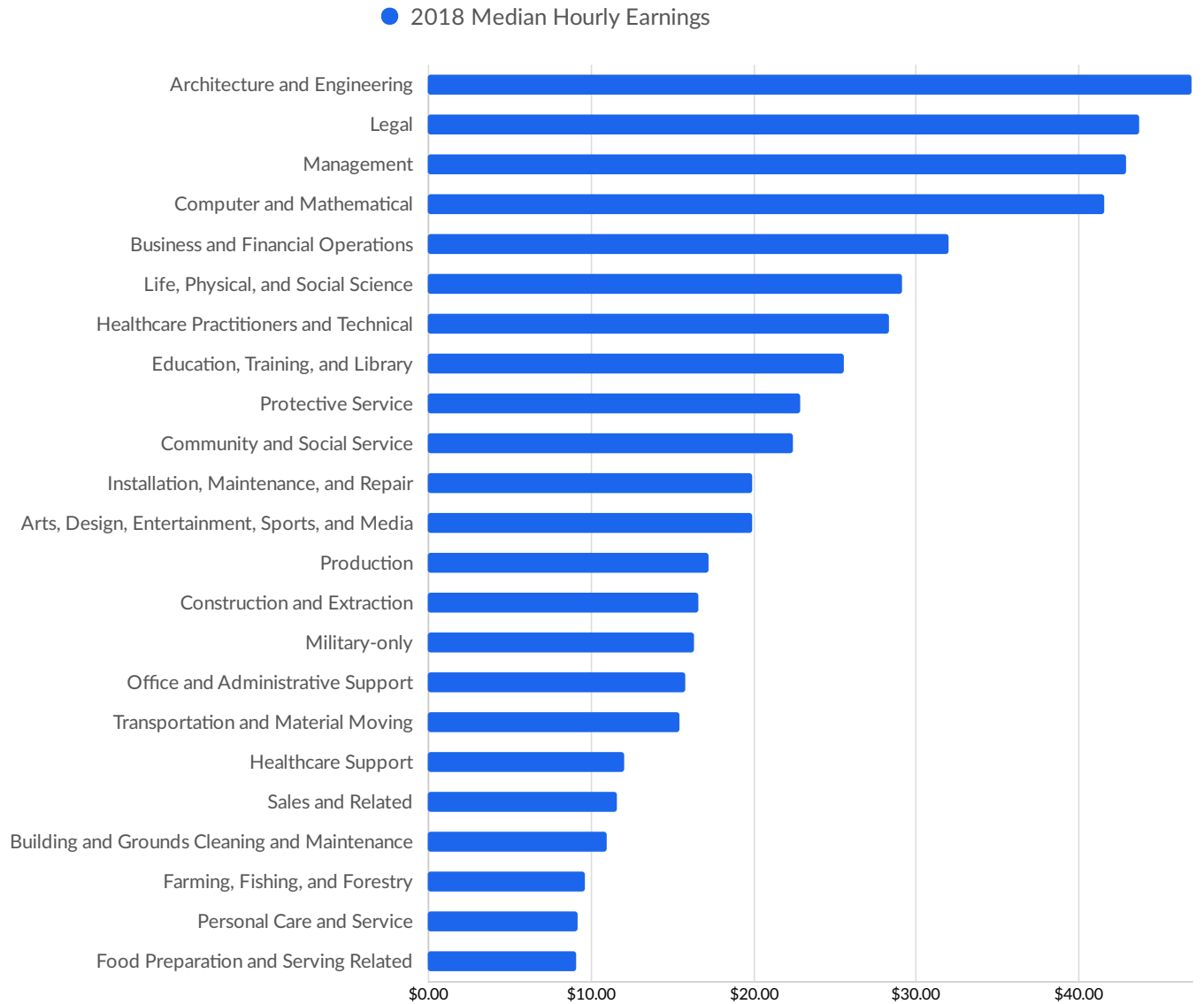

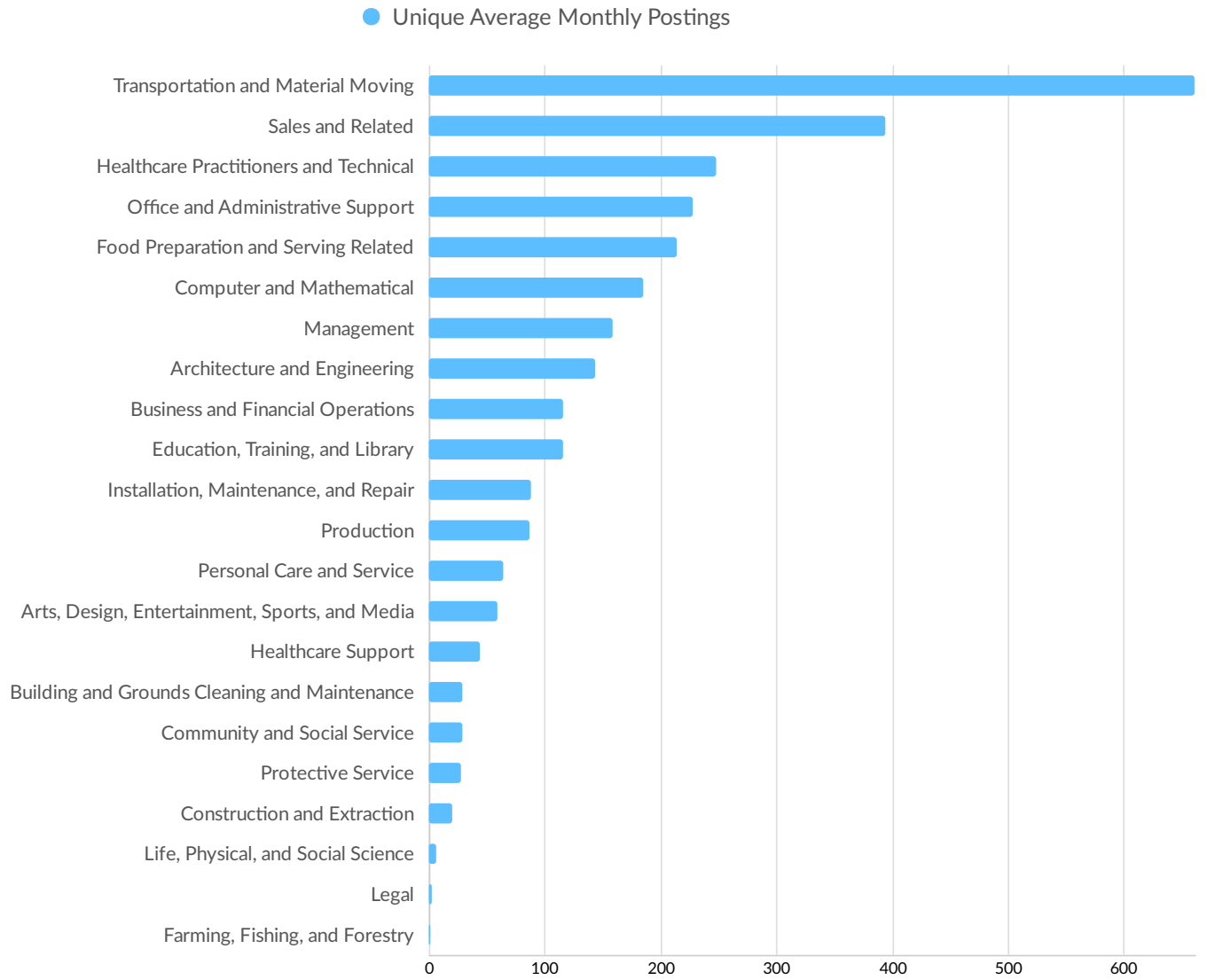

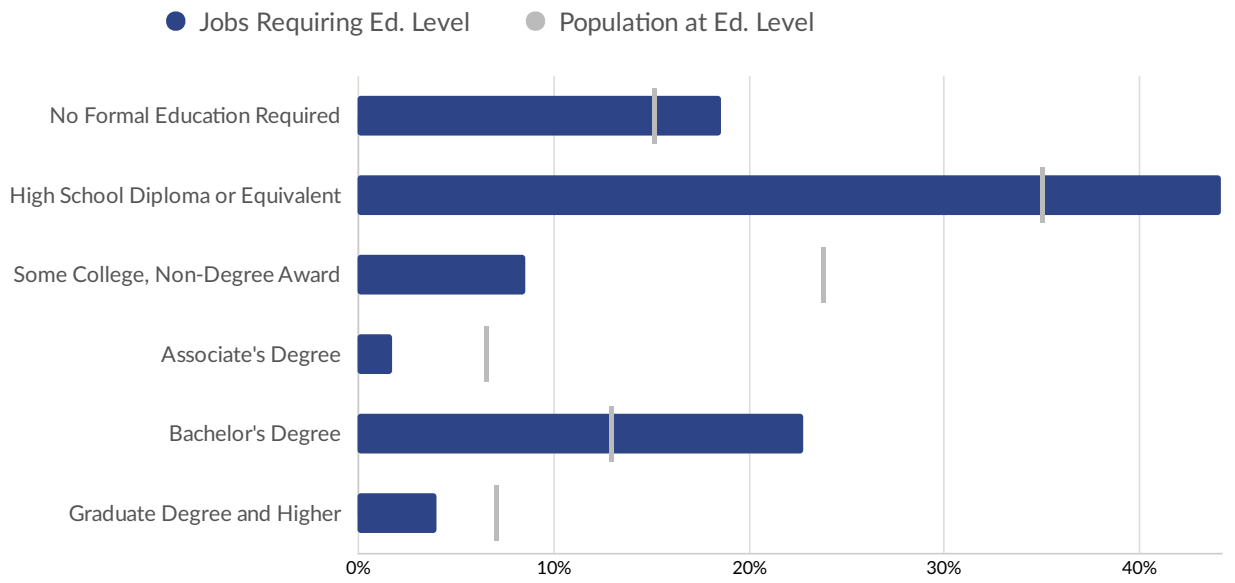
